PHYSICAL.

During the past year the Board of Education of the city of Elyria has maintained a physical examiner in the person of Mrs. Elizabeth August, a trained nurse. One striking result obtained, which answers very conclusively the question, "Did it Pay?" is that only 33 children have been absent during the past school year on account of illness due to contagious diseases as against over 800 during the school year of 1914-15.

The total number of children examined by Mrs. August was 2659 and the total physical defects found was 1201.

The report given by Mrs. August is very comprehensive and shows defective teeth, eyes, ears, nose were treated and defects corrected, in many cases without charge by local dentists and physicians.

Sixty adenoid operations on fifty eight tonsil operations are reported. The main reason that Wauseon does not have a physical examiner or district nurse is lack of funds. Here is a chance for real philanthropy.

REMEDIES FOR CHIGGERS.

If a bath is taken in hot water or with strong soap soon after exposure in shrubby and weeds infested with chiggers, or harvest mites usually no ill effects will be noticed from attacks of these pests. After long exposure, however, a bath has no effect, and a cooling substance should be applied to inflamed parts.

After irritation has set in, liberal applications of strong solution of ammonia, common baking soda or saleratus are recommended by R. D. Whitmarsh, assistant entomologist at the Ohio Experiment Station. A dilute solution of iodine or colloidion has also been found effective in many cases.

Persons visiting areas infested with chiggers may prevent attack by dusting flowers of sulphur or natholene in their clothes, especially below the knees.
