MAY PLACE OHIO BARN ON COMMON BARBERY PLANT. Because the common barberry and its purple varieties are responsible for the dissemination of the destructive cereal disease black stem rust which now attacks wheat, oats, barley, rye and cultivated grasses, N. E. Shaw, the Secretary of Agriculture, will call a meeting on November 20, at the State House Annex, Columbus, to consider a quarantine for this species.
