STATE UNION CENTRAL AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ROOMS. COLUMBUS, OHIO, JUNE 8, 1870.

Your annual State Convention will be held at Columbus, Ohio, on Wednesday the 10th day of August, 1870, for the nomination of candidates for the following offices, viz:

Secretary of State, Judge of the Supreme Court, Comptroller of the Public Accounts, Member of the Board of Public Works.

The undersigned committee recommend that the meetings in the several counties for the selection of delegates, be held on Saturday, July 10th, 1870.

The basis of representation in the convention will be one delegate for every five hundred voters and one additional delegate for every fraction of two hundred and fifty voters and upward in each county.

The undersigned committee respectfully suggest the importance of full delegation from each county to the convention. The names to be nominated in the present campaign are of vital interest to the country.

The importance of thorough local organization can not be too strongly urged; we can do this great auxiliary work only by the aid of the local organization. In this connection, the committee would earnestly recommend that every county committee be organized at the earliest possible date.

It is important that each delegation to the State Convention be organized in a correct list of the officers and members, with proper office address, of the counties they represent, and deliver the same to this committee.

It is hoped that a full attendance will be had in each township. The basis of representation in the State Convention will be one delegate for every twenty-five voters east for Governor Hayes in 1870, and one additional delegate for every fraction of thirteen votes and upwards in each Township or Ward.
