Fatal Accident—Tuesday of last week a party, consisting of J. Hamilton, Esq., Col. Jas. Stevens, Henry Gray, Wm. Baid and H. M. Becker, all of Melbourne, passed through Tiffin to Crane Creek, Ottawa Co., on a hunting expedition. They arrived at their destination on Wednesday evening and at once proceeded to fix up a camp in high spirits. Everything was arranged in good order and the party enjoyed their life in the woods with great zest until Saturday morning, when an accident occurred which threw all into grief and consternation.

It appears that Mr. Becker had followed the trail of a large buck to a considerable distance, and stepped on a log to look around and ascertain if he was in view. While thus engaged his rifle slipped off his shoulder, and he attempted to lift it, the hammer caught in the lock or the jammer knot and was discharged, the ball striking the unfortunate man on the right lower rib, breaking it, and passing through the lungs, lodging in the upper part of the left lung.

Notwithstanding the severity of his wound, Mr. Becker walked one-half mile to a house in the woods, where he found another hunting party, one of whom, fortunately, was a physician, Dr. J. Baid, who did all that was possible to alleviate his sufferings, but without avail. Mr. Becker did not lose consciousness, but conversed with those around, telling how the accident occurred, giving such information and directions as he deemed necessary. He made a confession of faith, and fell calmly into that sleep that knows no waking.

His horror-stricken friends did not arrive until some time after his death, which occurred about three hours after the accident.

Mr. Becker removed to Melbourne from Lebanon, Pa., where his parents reside, about two years since, and was engaged with A. B. Salter in the dry goods business. He was a young man of irreproachable character, respected and beloved by all who knew him and his loss will be severely felt in that community.

Five Hundred Dollars Worth of Goods

The Sunday Schools of Bloom and Eden Townships were for some time held in the Presbyterian Church. The goods were broken into, and about \$500 worth of silver spoons, plated knives, forks and other fine table cutlery were stolen. The robbery was first discovered by Mrs. Arnold, who occupies rooms in the rear of the store getting water, and saw a basket with two pieces of silver-ware in it, and also noticed that a board was up against the door. Thinking that it might be something wrong, she removed the board and pushed the door open. She immediately sent word to the proprietors of the store. Immediately upon being given, she went to work and discovered the robbery. A man was suspected who came to the city on Sunday morning, and was arrested at his name at the Shavian House as E. W. Morris, of Chicago. Clerk French recognized him as a man who was here in the fall and gave his name as W. W. Waddington of New York, and upon comparing the two names the hand writing was found to correspond exactly. From this it was considered that the man was suspicious and officers were warned of it. This man paid his bill at eight and was going off on the 7:30 train. He was seen after that train had gone, and the first night watchman on duty at the store at 11 o'clock, when he was last sight of him. When the second night watchman on duty was informed of the suspicion in regard to this man, but treated the matter indifferently, and was not seen again.

Sunday morning, as soon as the wires could be secured, the conductor of the night train, which passes through the city at 11 o'clock, was telegraphed to and a description of the man given. He replied that a man answering to the description got on at Tiffin for Clyde and said he was going to Newark. The station along the C. & T. road was telegraphed, and also Cleveland. From Cleveland an answer was received that a man had been arrested, and a description of Morris and the goods asked for. This was given, and the train did not correspond, the New York runner, as he afterwards proved to be, was allowed to go. Up to this time, no robbery had been reported in the city.

Sir:—Your letter of the 10th inst. relative to stamp duty on time drafts for less than \$100 has been received. They are considered exempt, like promissory notes, for a similar reason.
