Bowling Green has finally concluded that she wants an electric road and the council has passed a resolution authorizing the clerk to receive bids for the construction of the road. Just what route will be taken so as to reach Toledo is not determined but it is believed the new line will come to Perryburg along the old Plank road, as it is the most direct route, and passes through a rich farming district. This route being the most direct would enable the cars to make better time between Bowling Green and Toledo, a matter which would be of much importance to business men and others.

The second meeting of the Senatorial committee was held at Findlay, Monday. As a result of a careful consideration, taking into account precedents, the Griffin delegation from Lucas was endorsed, by what we are informed, a unanimous vote. It was hardly possible for the committee to do otherwise under the circumstances. The opposition against Mr. Griffin is not near so pronounced as it was, and it is to be hoped that all will end well. - N. B. Beacon July 12.

That Mr. Griffin will be nominated for Senator there is no doubt, and if we judge by the past, he will poll a strong vote in Lucas county, to which county he has been a powerful and faithful servant. Whatever may be said against him by his enemies, none will deny the fact that he is a legislator of great ability and has always stood faithful to his party and constituents, and before election day much of the dissension that is reported throughout the district will be laid aside and the earnest supporters of Foraker will be the supporters of Griffin and the rest of the ticket.

The Republican Executive Committee met in Bowling Green on Tuesday for the purpose of recommending to the Secretary of State the name of a Republican to be appointed a member of the County Board of Elections, vice J. B. Wilson, whose term of office expires this fall. There were present Messrs. R. W. McMahan, chairman, J. B. Wilson, secretary, and J. R. Hankey, G. C. Nearing, G. Wilkinson, E. L. Blue. Absent, J. E. Ladd. The meeting was harmonious, and the session was a brief one. After discussing the situation and concluding that the "outside townships" should be represented, Mr. Wilson moved that the name of George W. Wilkinson, be presented to the Secretary of State for appointment. Mr. Wilkinson very politely thanked the committee for the courtesy, and stated that he preferred that someone, not a member of the committee, be given the appointment. His objections were "overruled by the court" and he was unanimously elected. The honor is most worthily bestowed and the JOURNAL believes will give general satisfaction.

Cutting weeds and thistles and repairing culvert on Mulberry street was referred to Street Committee.

The bill of Miss Beach for wall paper and paint used on the Way house was rejected.

July 15, Council met in adjourned session. Present, the Mayor and Councilmen Barton, Hanson, Mungler, Schlect and Wild and the Clerk, Absent - Bowers.

The object of the session was for the further discussion of the condition of sidewalks, and a resolution to repair and rebuild sidewalks was unanimously passed.

A petition signed by citizens requesting the cleaning of Crooked creek was read and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Benj. Zingg asked to have the Council pay for sinking a well in the eastern part of town. The matter was referred to the Finance Committee.
