

### COURT HOUSE NEWS

James & Kelly have commenced suit against Ella C. Hull for \$50 for legal services.

Application has been made for the appointment of an administrator for the estate of Silas H. Powell.

Three separate answers have been filed by Baldwin & Harrington for the defendants in the case of Edward Beverstock against J. Walter Wells et al. Their substance is a general denial of the statements made in the petition.

The defendants in the case of Oliver W. Smith against Mazie and August Fisher deny the allegations made by plaintiff, and state that the real agreement with reference to payment of taxes on the land sold was left out of the deed through error.

A. C. and R. D. Steyenson, executors of T. D. Stevenson, are suing Elizabeth and Peter Simonis for \$170.67, secured, they say, by mortgage on Fostoria lots.

The T. U. & I. denies that Ethel Wilson sustained any injuries through negligence of theirs, as she alleged.

The Hocking Valley railway denies any complicity in the death of one steer owned by George Phillips. He made the H. V. and T. F. & F. defendants in a damage suit.

The Toledo, Fostoria & Findlay Electric railway denies the allegation of George Phillipps charging it with negligence and being responsible for the death of a steer belonging to the plaintiff. The animal was killed August 2 and Phillips wants \$45.


