The list of candidates continues to increase. It is well. It gives the voter a better chance to select good men for the offices.

There's a new "Richmond" in the field of Wood county politics. J. E. Kelly, a hustling attorney of Bowling Green, seeks the nomination as one of the Representatives to the Ohio Legislature.

With Toledo automobilists racing on Front street of Perrysburg on Sunday, it is quite proper that Mayor Roether order out the speed catching squad and teach a few of the law violators a few lessons on how to respect the village laws.

The weather man has no complaints due him for the awful dope he has been dealing to the public for the past week. Perhaps the comet has had a hand in the business, and if so, nobody will regret the fact that it will be another 75 years before it will again visit the earth.

We must apologize to our readers because we have given up so much space to politics this week, but the fact is, we consider it our duty to give the public all possible information regarding candidates who are seeking nomination for the various offices. Hon. George E. Reed has introduced a bill in the Legislature to authorize the appropriation of \$6,000 for the purpose of building driveways, walks, barn and planting trees, shrubs and plants on Fort Meigs. It is understood that this appropriation when expended will make the Fort property self-sustaining. This bill stands a very good chance of passing both houses and the people of this locality are highly pleased with the efforts made by Representative Reed to have the state assist in beautifying the old Fort property.

Maumee will soon have her Main street nicely paved and by this means the village assumes an air of progress and enterprise that is really refreshing. Perhaps, by the time Halley's comet makes its next visit to earth, the village of Perrysburg may, possibly—just possibly—have cleaned off the one passable street the town now affords. Of course we would not be so bold as to suppose any of our streets will be paved. However, by that time, the most of us will probably be walking the golden streets of Paradise, and will not care whether or not Perrysburg streets are paved.

The exodus of our good citizens to Canada is steadily increasing, and another wave of emigration from the United States to Mexico has set in. It is estimated that not less than fifty thousand heads of families, most of them successful farmers, expatriated themselves in 1909 and took up homes under the British flag. All of them had money, probably none had less than \$1,000, so that at least \$50,000,000 of good American coin was taken from this country and invested in Canadian property. The lure of cheap land is strong and as long as the Canadian Northwest offers its virgin prairies to homeseekers at low prices, the rush of settlers is likely to continue. Land values, however, have steadily risen, and with the passing of Canadian lands selling at \$3 to \$15 per acre it is probable that the opportunities for homeseekers in our own west may prove sufficiently attractive to stem the Northwest tide.

Many tax-payers who have carefully studied this question have earnestly requested me to become a candidate for re-election.


