Ohio Commission Brings Sunshine Into Lives of Sightless.

To be blind is a tragedy which not one of us would wish to face. To be blind and idle is an even greater tragedy.

The Ohio Commission for the Blind is endeavoring to lessen the burden of a life in darkness by sending home teachers to visit the blind in their homes. Sometimes little can be done

to improve the situation; usually, however, the home teacher is able to bring at least encouragement by showing that in spite of her blindness she is still able to be of service in the world. These state home teachers give instruction wherever desired in reading, in sewing, knitting and other forms of handwork.

Many a shut-in blind person has not only been greatly cheered by the visits of the commission's home teachers, but also enabled to earn something towards their support.
