## PUT RELIGIOUS FREEDOM INTO LEAGUE COVENANT

Officially announced in Paris That Amendment Has Been Adopted

It has been officially announced from Paris that the Covenant of the League of Nations has been amended by putting in safeguards against religious persecution.

The same amendment is said to provide against any legal discriminations on account of religious differences of opinion; but this is not clearly stated in the dispatch. In some countries there are laws that no one can vote or hold office unless he is of the established religion.

Jews have lately been active in trying to get something into the League Covenant which would prevent the

persecutions to which their race and religion has been subjected in many lands; particularly of late in Poland.
