The labor plank of the Ohio republican platform, adopted by the convention held at Columbus, August 25, 1886, reads as follows:

Fifth—The republican party has ever stood as the friend of labor against all who would either oppress or enslave it; and every measure, state or national, which would protect the laborer from dangerous foreign competition, or improve and dignify his condition at home, will meet with our unqualified approval. Unswerving in our hostility to anarchism, socialism and communism, we favor such wise legislation as may insure that harmony which ought always to prevail between employer and employe. We recognize the right of all men by association to promote their mutual good and protection, in every way that does not infringe upon the rights of others. We favor the creation by congress of a national department of labor, the head of which shall be a cabinet officer, whose duty it shall be to collect, synthesize and publish statistical information relating to the social, sanitary, educational and commercial condition of the workmen of the nation. We demand that all officials, state or national, charged with the duty of enforcing laws which provide for the proper security of the lives and health of workmen, shall be protected men.

CORRINTUCK JOE

Our Ohio legislature, in May last, enacted a law (House Bill, No. 416), which provides for the relief of indigent United States soldiers, sailors and marines, and widows and minor children of indigent or deceased United States soldiers, sailors and marines.

The act authorizes the levy of not to exceed one-tenth of a mill on all the taxable property in each county for the purpose of creating a relief fund for the indigent soldiers, sailors, marines, etc.

Section 2 of the act provides that the board of trustees of the several counties in this state make a written report to the county commissioners of each county by the first Monday in June of each year, giving a list of all the resident indigent United States soldiers, sailors or marines, or indigent widows or minor children of the same requiring aid and entitled to relief under this act, and the probable amount necessary for that purpose during the coming year. At their June session the county commissioners shall examine the reports and make such order as may be necessary to provide for the relief.

The next step, under the provisions of the law, is taken by the common pleas judge, who shall before the first Monday in October appoint three persons, residents of such county, at least two of whom shall be honorably discharged United States soldiers, one to serve three years, one for two years and one for one year, from date of appointment, and each year thereafter one person to serve for three years. Such persons are to be known as the "Soldiers' Relief Commission."

Section 4 provides that this commission shall meet on or before the first Monday in December, of each year, and at such other times as may be necessary, and carefully examine the lists of those reported as needing relief, and make such order as may be necessary to person or family. They may also furnish relief to any soldier, sailor, etc., living within the county, whose name may not be found on the lists, but whose right to relief under this act may be established to the satisfaction of the commission.

The commission then make out a list of those to whom relief is granted, giving name and place of residence and amount to be paid each month, and on or before the first day of each month, the county auditor will issue his warrant upon the treasurer of the county for the sum designated in each case, and deliver it to the person entitled thereto, taking a receipt for it. The men composing the commission will receive only their necessary expenses for their services.

We learn from the Sandusky Register that the commissioners of Erie county have taken advantage of the provisions of the law, and organized a county "Soldiers' Relief Commission." In passing this law, the legislature has shown its humanity and patriotism and reflected honor upon the state.

Our Candidate.
