State Affairs. Governor Foraker's Unanswerable Statements. MR. POWELL'S FLIMS Y TALES TORN INTO TATTERED SHREDS.

Let me briefly state something of what we have been doing in regard to financial matters. I think you are, in a general way, at least familiar with the fact that when I was inaugurated we found a rather discouraging prospect for the state of Ohio. The first thing Governor Hoody told me was that we were on the verge of going to protest. He said it would be impossible, he thought, for us to go beyond the list of May then we had when not borrowing money, and when I looked at the figures I was only too true.
