Pictures by Machinery.

In the new drop-nickel photograph machine the time required to produce the picture is one and three-quarter minutes. From the beginning of the operation until the completed picture no hand has touched the plate. There is an arrangement on the front of the case by which the time of developing may be shortened or prolonged as a darkly or lightly printed picture is wanted. The picture after being dropped out is taken by an attendant and dried and fitted in a neat brass case; for this latter service an additional nickel is charged. The machine is equipped with four hundred small plates, known to the photographic trade as argentic dry plates, and sufficient chemicals for a day's run.
