TO THE CITIZENS OF NEWCASTLE :- Re-To the Chizkes of Newcastle:—Re-alizing the disgrace brought upon myself and the city by my conduct in the assault made by me upon J. E. Leslie on Mon-day, I wish in this public manner to con-fess that I countited a sin against God, a crime against the laws of the common-wealth and city ordinances, and a wrong against Mr Leslie which even the publi-cation of the many agreements articles. estion of the many scarrillous articles
that have appeared in the Graphid' during the past ten months will not justify,
and especially in one helding the responsible position of chief executive of the city and an office bearer in a Christian

"I have earnestly asked God's forgive ness, and I here publicly and humbly ask the forgiveness of the citizens of Newcustle. I have authorized the Chief of Police to see that I pay the penalty for violation of a city ordinance, and I for violation of a city ordinance, and I fully expect and concede Mr. Leslie's right to proceed against me under the laws of the State.
