DID HE MURDER TWO Mrs. Leonard's Slayer Accused of Another Crime.

MILKMAN MUTTER'S SUSPICION. He is Positive that Harlot is the Man Who Killed His Wife.

The Deed Was Committed in Newark, N. J., Two Years Ago—The Manner of Proceeding the Same in Both Cases—Mutter Will Try to Identify Harlot at Freehold To-day—The Murderer Refuses to Talk.

ATLANTIC HIGHLANDS, N. J., Dec. 1.—There were decidedly sensational developments in the Leonard-Harlot murder case yesterday, and the excitement caused by the horrible butchery of the poor woman has increased tenfold.

That is he. That is the slayer of my wife," said one of the men. "Thank God he has been captured. I have been hunting him for two years."

Two years ago his family consisted of himself, his wife and his little son. Mutter discharged his man of all work and went to an employment agency in New York where he engaged a young German to tend his cattle and help get his milk ready for market.

One pleasant fall day Mr. Mutter drove to Newark with a wagon-load of milk. When he drove up to the barn late in the afternoon he missed the usual cheery greeting of his wife and little boy.

He went to the house. In the kitchen he found the almost lifeless body of his young wife, lying in a big pool of blood. A piece of heavy clothes line was knotted tightly around her throat and her face was a mass of cuts and bruises.

The murderer of Mrs. Leonard followed the same general plan as the slayer of Mrs. Mutter, and there is no question that the husband of the latter thinks that the young farm hand who killed his wife is also the slayer of Mrs. Leonard.

Harlot refuses to say anything to his fellow prisoners in the Freehold jail. He sits all day long with his face buried in his hands, or lies on his back on his rough bed in his cell staring at the ceiling. He does not read and eats but little. He is closely watched by Sheriff Snook.
