PRESIDENT AT ATLANTA
He Arouses the Enthusiasm of the Ex-Confederates.

A MOST NOTABLE DECLARATION.
"In the Spirit of Fraternity, We Should Share With You in the Care of the Graves of the Confederate Dead."

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 15.—President McKinley made memorable the first day of the Atlanta peace jubilee by a notable utterance in his speech before the joint session of the Georgia legislature yesterday afternoon. His reception by the general assembly was warm and hearty in the extreme, and his speech was interrupted with frequent outbursts of cheering. It is admitted on all sides that the address marked an epoch in history, and it is today on every lip. Upon the president's arrival at the capitol he was greeted with a field artillery salute and was at once escorted to Governor Chandler's office. There a short informal reception took place. Upon its conclusion the president was conducted to the assembly chamber, where he occupied the speaker's chair, with Governor Chandler on his right. The speaker introduced the president to the Governor. During the course of his short speech Mr. McKinley referred to his notes, and constantly paused for the cheers to stop. A scene of intense enthusiasm followed when, amid impressive silence, the words fell from the lips of the president:

"Every soldier's grave made during the unfortunate civil war is a tribute to American valor. And while, when these graves were made, we differed widely about the policy of the government, those differences were long ago settled by the arbitration of arms—and the time has now come in the evolution of sentiment and feeling under the providence of God when, in the spirit of fraternity, we should share with you in the care of the graves of the Confederate soldiers."

Old men who fought for the south rose from their seats and waved their hats. One Confederate veteran now a general in the army, and another passed forward until he was leaning against the speaker's desk, hanging on each word the president uttered. When the reference was made to the Confederate dead this old man buried his head in his arms, and when cheers rang out cried like a little child. All the many oratorical speeches which have been made since Grant said "Let us have peace," nothing has more deeply stirred a southern audience than these simple words of President McKinley.

No sooner had President McKinley concluded before there were loud cries for Wheeler, and when that little man got up, his head scarcely higher than the speaker's desk, the audience once more gave vent to wild enthusiasm. "The army," in conjunction with the navy, was ordered to attack and destroy the Spanish forces at Santiago. In four weeks that order was obeyed and its purposes accomplished. The proud Spaniard nation stood suing for peace from the nation which a month before it had held up to ridicule and scorn."

Calls for Brigadier General Young brought that officer to his feet with a short speech regarding the conditions of the army campaign in the south. He said that no troops in the world were better, more repaid and treated than were the troops in South Carolina and Georgia. General Lawton was loudly cheered, but refused to make a speech. He simply thanked, on behalf of his men, the legislature and the people of Georgia for their tribute to himself. Secretary Alger refused to speak, and the legislature dissolved.

The president held a private reception in the senate chamber and afterward a public reception on the steps of the rotunda. There were hundreds of southerners crushed and jostled by each other in their anxiety to shake a northern president's hand.

The day's festivities included a unique "Bona Fide" which was reviewed by the president and a festival last night to the distinguished guests at the Capital City club.

SPANIARDS TO BLAME
For the Murderous Riot in Havana Last Sunday Night.

Havana, Dec. 15.—American observers of the violent scenes enacted here on Sunday night sympathize with the Cuban population over the killing of 15 others by Spanish soldiers. Nevertheless, the American military men are unable to do more than they have done in securing safe transportation for prominent Cubans to Marianan and in preventing all arrests excepting those of three youngsters, who, however, were afterwards released. The shooting was nearly all done by Spanish officers armed with pistols. Some shots were fired during the conflict at aggressive Cubans, but most of them were fired at retreating Cubans. Not one of the officers implicated has been brought to account. It is asserted that the feeling in the Spanish army is one of pleasure that the Cubans gave the Spaniards the opportunity to kill a few of them.

The first arrivals of American troops and the approaching dissolution of Spanish sovereignty on all sides in Havana increases the Spanish bitterness here. The only safety of the Cubans is in their remaining patient for a week or two longer, until the seventh army corps shall have arrived. The American officers constantly urge the Cuban leaders to counsel silence and self-surrender for a while, as fire-brand Cubans cannot be protected, even by the moral influence of the American representatives. Spanish sovereignty, it is pointed out, is the only sovereignty here, and unless there shall be an interregnum of anarchy Spanish authority must remain supreme until the American troops shall be here in force and the flag shall have been changed.

Killed and Eaten by Cannibals.
Brussels, Dec. 15.—Advices received here from the governor of the upper Congo country, the natives brought by the steamer Leopoldville from Africa, which arrived at Antwerp Tuesday, that four Belgian traders had been killed and eaten by the natives of Upper Unghai. The governor adds that the traders' accoutrements and clothes were massacred and that another detachment of 40 soldiers in charge of two white officers, who were proceeding to the assistance of the traders, were surprised by the natives and all were put to death.

Colonel Simmons Convicted.
Chicago, Dec. 15.—Colonel William A. Simmons, formerly collector of the port at Boston, Mass., was convicted yesterday on a charge of swindling brought by Thomas B. Bryan, ex-president of the Union League club, and father of Colonel Charles Page Bryan, United States senator from Massachusetts. Simmons was accused of obtaining by false pretenses the signature of Thomas B. Bryan to a deed involving the exchange of some valuable Chicago improved real estate for 6,000 acres in Florida, which was represented to be a 310-acre tract, but which, it is alleged, was worth very much less.
