PITHY POINTS.

Amendments throughout the country. Original bill begins next Monday. The local coal trade is still booming. Reading says out over \$41,000 to maintain its fire department. Pen Cooper, of Mahanoy City, and H. Calder, of Reading, two crack shots, were matched to shoot at the former place on March 10, for a prize of \$400. The Ashland Coal and Coke Co., on Saturday declared a three per cent. dividend. D. J. Slattery, who has been confined to his bed the past several weeks with sickness, resumed his duties as agent at the P. & R. station at Girardville.

The commission from the Governor to Notary Public John Smith, of Mahanoy City, is received. Benjamin M. Neal, of Harrisburg, has been appointed receiver of the First National Bank of Clearfield, in place of the late ex-State Treasurer Haywood. Robbers tried to batter in a window of the railroad office at Girardville with a railroad tie, but Agent John A. Witherspoon called to his aid Michael Hehrlich, of Columbia, who served with the Fourth Regiment in Puerto Rico, wrote to his parents that he intended to join the regular army, and then fatally shot himself.

Nicholas and Nell Motz, brothers, of Hanover, recently arrived from the model several years ago of Francisco Mendonza, who was yesterday discharged, for lack of evidence against them. The furnaces in the Shenango Valley have advanced the wages of their employees 10 per cent., to take effect March 1. Four thousand men will be affected.

Henry Bender, superintendent of M. Michael's Hillside farm, and his wife and three children had a narrow escape from asphyxiation by coal gas on Sunday night.

Samuel Heffner, the postmaster and general merchant at Pottsville, has disappeared, apparently without any cause, leaving a wife and five small children. Girardville has a female barber, and all the young men get shaved at that shop.

Many of the churches are already preparing for Easter. It is again rumored that the P. & R. company has in contemplation the erection of a mammoth breaker at Locust Gap. There are 861 silk mills in the United States, of which 172 are in Pennsylvania, being the third largest number among the states.

Jacob Herman Lilly, for 30 years in the flour and feed business at Bethlehem, died. He was 78 years of age.

At St. John's, Luzerne county, David Bloom, formerly a Haeleton policeman, shot himself through the head. A runaway car at the Avondale colliery, Luzerne county, killed Alford Berchowski and fatally injured Ignatz Krishbach.

For the murder of Jack Roberts, John N. Dowden was yesterday sentenced at Greensburg to twenty years in the penitentiary. Leaving a sick bed yesterday, Charles York, a well-to-do farmer, of Macungie, Lehigh county, went to his ice pond and dropped dead with heart disease into three feet of water.

Rev. S. W. Pomeroy, who served with distinction in the Civil War, has given up the pastorate of the East End and Putnam Presbyterian churches, Centre county, and will make his home in Harrisburg.

Elastic Conscience. James J. McGarrity, New Philadelphia's tax collector, was at the court house on an important mission. He had taken down the names of seven Polish residents of his town, who, at his own's solicitation, were charged on taxes, had sworn they had paid them at other places in the county, the name of the town given having been taken in each instance by Collector McGarrity, who had determined to learn whether they were making false oaths. McGarrity's search at the court house revealed the fact that not one of the seven had paid taxes in the towns in which they swore to. Prosecutions may, therefore, be instituted.

Schuykill county, decree affirmed, appeal dismissed at appellant's costs; Brewer, Warden of Schuykill county prison, et al., vs. Kannier, et al., C. P., Schuykill, decree affirmed on his appeal sent up with the record, and appeal dismissed at appellant's costs; Safe Deposit Bank of Pottsville vs. County of Schuykill, O. C., Schuykill, judgment affirmed.

first witness called was Edward Witche. The Deputy District Attorney conducted the examinations. Witche repeated the same story he told yesterday and last night, while before Justice Shoemaker. He said he saw Hopkins play with a revolver at different times in the Foltz house, and reproved him for it.

James Botchin and Samuel Moreau used to call at the house. Witness was never at the Foltz house after 7 or 8 o'clock at night. He didn't see any drink in the Foltz house on Sunday, no one was drunk, and there was no evidence of bad feeling on the part of any one in the house. Several of the jurors asked the witness questions, but he kept in line with his story and nothing new developed. Witness never knew of any jealousy existing on Hopkins' part on account of the Michelski girl's relation with other fellows. Witness positively denied that he ever paid any attention to the Michelski girl, or that the shooting arose over any such attentions on his part. He said he never had a girl in his life, and the idea of paying attention to the Michelski girl never entered his mind. The hearing was still on when the HERALD went to press.

THE DEMOCRATIC POLICY

Regarding the Future Government of the Philippine Islands. Washington, Feb. 28.—At a caucus of the Democratic members of the house of representatives, held in the hall of the house last night, the following declaration of policy and resolutions as to the Philippines were adopted:

"We hold that the constitution of the United States was ordained and established for an intelligent, liberty-loving and self-governing people, and cannot be successfully applied to a people of slaves, held that a continental policy is contrary to the theory of our government and unwise of those great principles of civil liberty which we have been taught to cherish. We believe, with the declaration of independence, that all governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed, and we are unalterably opposed to the establishment of any government by the United States without the consent of the people to be governed, and uniformly with these principles we insist that the minority members of the foreign affairs committee to introduce and urge the following resolution:

"Resolved, That the United States hereby disclaim any disposition or intention to exercise permanent sovereignty, jurisdiction or control over the Philippine Islands, and assert their determination, when an independent government shall have been erected therein, to transfer to said government, upon terms which shall be reasonable and just, all rights secured under the condition of making an advance of 35 cents a ton on coal on their line and city trade within a day or two. This advance will make the price per ton at the mines: Broken, \$2.25; reg. \$2.40; stove and cleat, \$2.50.

COUNTY SEAT NEWS.

Happenings in and About the Seat of Justice.

Criminal court will open next Monday and there are already two hundred new cases ready for the grand jury, besides the large number that have been carried over from the last term. The District Attorney says the March term will be the heaviest in recent years. Among the number are two murder cases and three for misdemeanor in traffic.

Denah McCarthy, who shot and killed his mother while in a drunken rage, will be arraigned for murder, and John Herrick will be tried under the same charge because of the death of John Nicholls at Bear Ridge colliery two weeks ago. Shenandoah may present another murder trial.

A bill in equity was filed by George W. Ryan for Joanna Mikowski vs. Charles D. Kalor et al., trading as Charles D. Kalor Company, limited, in which the plaintiff seeks to have the defendants satisfy a mortgage.

There will be no new trial in the case of Edward and Richard Scott, of Pottsville, found guilty of interfering with an officer of the court fixed time for sentence.

Application has been made for the discharge of Charles Hofer under the insolvent law.

James Dehrs, who was acquitted at the last term of court, was sentenced to pay the costs.

Application was made for the appointment of William Silver, as auditor in Kilm town-ship.

The Controller and the County Commissioners have a little misunderstanding about passing upon bills. The Controller contends that all bills should first be presented to the Commissioners, while the latter takes the opposite view. The commissioners have the best of the argument, and to sustain their position quote the act creating the office of Controller. The controversy is merely a question of responsibility.

A nil pros was entered in the case of Henry Weller, the prosecutor failing to appear.

A decree of distribution was filed in the estate of Elizabeth Shuster, deceased.

In the estate of Wm. Shugars, deceased, Court directed a citation to an issue on Jacob Clifton Shugars, executor, to file an account.

Margaret Barnhardt was appointed guardian of Oliver Henry Glick, minor child of Joseph Glick, late of Girardville, deceased. Bond in the sum of \$1,000 was filed and approved.
