AN INSURANCE SWINDLE

Company Paid Death Penalty on a Man Very Much Alive.

AN AFFIDAVIT TO THAT EFFECT.

The body on which insurance was paid was found in the room of a Los Angeles widow, who the alleged dead man will marry.

Chicago, Dec. 27.—As a result of the telegram sent to Los Angeles, Cal., stating that Aaron Wolfson, on the finding of whose supposed body the New York Life Insurance company paid the public administrator of his estate \$10,000, was alive in this city, Attorney Edward O'Byrne, of the company, received several messages yesterday asking for a confirmation.

Wolfson's identification is complete," said Mr. O'Byrne. "Besides his own affidavit I have the sworn statements of 20 others who knew him, among them his brother-in-law, Michael Hesselberg, of St. Louis, and his cousin, Rose Blumenthal, of this city.

The strange story had its beginning on July 10 last. Aaron Wolfson was then living in Los Angeles, Cal. On that date his father, Benjamin Wolfson, a tailor, of St. Louis, received news that his son was dead, from inhaling gas with suicidal intent, in the rooms of a woman, who at that time returned to give her name. The son's life was insured for \$10,000 in the New York Life Insurance company. On the day after the discovery was made by an uncle residing in that city, and the young man's parents were notified, and on Aug. 11 the attorneys, Sale & Sale, of St. Louis, wired to the headquarters of the New York Life Insurance company, who immediately made a demand upon the public administrator for \$10,000, the amount of the insurance on Wolfson's life, which is still held by him.

Before leaving here Wolfson said that he would marry her. His bride, it is understood, will be the Los Angeles widow, who is identified as Mrs. O'Neil, whose identification of the supposed body Wolfson induced the insurance company to pay the face of the policy to the public administrator.

"We paid nothing to Wolfson for coming forward," said Mr. O'Byrne. "The money was given to the widow, who we were offered information and affidavits regarding him if we would pay \$3,500."

FAIRBANKS' PREDICTIONS.

Senator Declares Roberts Will Be Sent Back to Utah.

Indianapolis, Dec. 27.—Senator Charles W. Fairbanks arrived here yesterday and gave the following interview outlining the senate program and commenting upon national questions. He said:

"The first thing after the holiday recess will be the consideration of the currency bill. This matter will be taken up on Jan. 4, and there will in all probability be a month of debate. The bill will pass the senate beyond all doubt.

"After that there may be some discussion about the Philippine question if the resolutions of Senator Hoar receive attention. However, the opportunity of discussing this question will be given during the next presidential campaign, as it will be one of the leading questions. The phase of the question which will receive attention at the hands of the senate will be the best way to immediately cease hostilities and bring the islands under the subjugation of the United States. The sentiment in favor of retaining the islands is very strong in Washington.

"The investigation of the Roberts case is in the hands of the court appointed for that purpose and the final decision will likely be made in the near future. There can be but one outcome, and that is that he will be instructed to return to the state of Utah."

Cannot Prevent Money Panics.

Washington, Dec. 27.—Mr. Roberts, the director of the mint, was asked yesterday as to whether the present monetary stringency, in his opinion, signified an actual scarcity of money to meet the present requirements of trade. He said: "No possible supply of money can prevent stock exchange panic or periods of monetary stringency, because speculation and rising prices will absorb any possible increase until the pressure for ready cash is just as great upon the banks as it was upon the old. The cry for more money is as unappeasable as the demand for more wealth. A new supply, instead of satisfying the demand, stimulates it."

Insurgents' Attack Subj. Garrison.

Manila, Dec. 27.—General Santa Ana, with a force of insurgents estimated at 300, attacked the garrison at Subj yesterday. A body of marines were sent from Olongapo to reinforce the garrison, and the Philippines were driven off, several being killed, there were no casualties on the American side. A company of the forty-sixth volunteer infantry, together with a contingent of marines, has been sent from Manila to reinforce the Subj garrison still further.

Death of a Noted Scientist.

Baltimore, Dec. 27.—Professor Elliott Coues, of Washington, the world famed ornithologist and scientist, died Monday night at Johns Hopkins hospital. Professor Coues was one of our most distinguished scientists in the United States. Born in Portsmouth, N. H., in 1842, he graduated at the Columbian university, in Washington, in 1861. He entered the United States army as a medical cadet in 1862, and left it as a surgeon many years later. He was killed here in self defense. He was one of the associate editors of the Century Dictionary and other publications.

FIFTEEN SALORS LOST!

Unknown Bark Went Down With All On Board.

FUTILE ATTEMPTS AT RESCUE.

A Boston Crew From the British Steamer Noramora Starred For the Imperilled Vessel, But Their Boat Was Capsized in the Heavy Sea.

Norfolk, Va., Dec. 27.—With her great steel hull bent and riddled by murderous seas, two propeller blades gone and steel lifeboats transformed by giant waves so that they resembled the figure "8," the overdue Johnston liner Noramora, a 10,000-ton vessel, the largest tramp boat afloat, arrived in port last night, 23 days out from Liverpool, after encountering a hurricane of tremendous proportion and one that nearly sent the big ship to the bottom of the ocean.

Captain Richardson brought the first news of the loss of a bark in mid-ocean with 15 souls, of the almost unequalled heroism on the part of a boat's crew from his ship in an attempt to save the lives of those on the sinking ship and how in the hurricane and darkness his own men narrowly escaped death.

When the bark was sighted, flying signals of distress, the Noramora bore down on the distressed vessel and could not see that she was already washed, all masts gone, the crew waving banners and frantically begging to be saved. A crew from the Noramora volunteered to man a lifeboat, and in the height of the storm a steel boat was crippled.

The cries of the imperilled ones were now pitiable, but the lifeboat hardly left the Noramora when a tremendous wave overturned it and the would-be rescuers were precipitated into the sea. They fortunately wore life belts and managed to right the boat. Lines had by this time been thrown to them and they were pulled through the waves to the Noramora.

A second attempt was made to rescue those aboard the bark, but she had disappeared in the darkness and storm. Although in imminent peril himself, Captain Richardson stood by until morning and then steamed to where he had seen the bark, but she had sunk with all on board.

No wreckage could be seen, and it was impossible to learn her name or destination. She appeared to have had three masts and evidently had been loaded with a bulky cargo. The bark was a vessel of probably 1,000 tons. The storm continued with unabated fury, and the Noramora had to change her course several times, finally heading for Norfolk.

Captain Richardson said in all his experience he never encountered such a storm. The big ship sustained severe damage and will have to be completely hulked and swept everything movable from the decks. Several of the sailors were tossed about and received injuries.
