THE CONDEMNED PRIEST. CARRERLAND MENTAL CHARACTERISTICS OF BLASINS PISTORIUS AS DESCRIBED BY AN ACQUAINTANCE IN GERMANY. The Baltimore News contains the following letter from its European correspondent in relation to the early history of Blasius Pistorius, the Pennsylvania priest condemned to be hanged for the murder of Farmer Isaac Jaquette, near Norristown.
