Some Selling of Coppers Today—Denn-Arizona Makes New High Record—Rumored that Calumet & Arizona Dividend Will Be \$5.00.

GLOBE, January 8.—The copper market today was a little tired and more dull than for weeks. Allowez was well bought up to \$70.50, but support was withdrawn, close being weak at \$68 bid. North Butte and Range held well. Calumet & Arizona was well bought on rumor from Houghton that the next dividend would probably be \$5 quarterly. Denn-Arizona made a new high price today, opening at \$42 and closing at \$45. Superior & Pittsburg holds strong. Another rich ore body was encountered in the Houghton shaft yesterday. You will wake up some of these mornings and find Superior & Pittsburg selling above \$30. Shannon was strong, advancing up to \$21 several times during the day. It is thought that Shannon and Butte Coalition will be quick movers in a short time. Globe Consolidated held strong at \$9.87 the entire day. Superior & Boston is quiet and holds at \$4.50 bid and \$5 asked.

In New York there was considerable selling of Amalgamated and United States Steel, the latter on rumor that J. P. Morgan was seriously ill, but this was officially denied. Nevertheless, the traders hammered the list during the afternoon, but the close was active and a little stronger.

It is thought that the Bank of England rate will be lowered on the 17th and that call money will harden between now and the 15th, but will ease off afterwards, as indications are that currency receipts will be large from that time on. Trust companies are now fully supplied with legal reserves and this drag on the market has been removed.

All advices say to buy coppers that have merit and hold for a good advance.

FREE SCHOLARSHIP

Arizona May Pass Bill of Clifton School Principal

Much favorable comment is being heard here on a school bill which Professor Halverson of the Clifton schools has prepared to be presented to the legislature which will convene on January 23.

The bill provides for the establishment of a scholarship for each county of the territory in the University of Arizona. It provides further that the scholarship shall be awarded by competitive examination.

The bill provides that the successful student shall be allowed \$150 per year for expenses and that this sum shall be paid out of the territorial treasury. As there are thirteen counties in the territory this would mean an expenditure of but \$1,950.

It is believed by educators that the scholarships will arouse a beneficial rivalry among students in every county and will also increase the university attendance thirteen each year.

ATTY. MORRISON BOOSTS GLOBE

Says District Is to Be Considered as One of the Coming Districts of the World—Gives Interview to Bisbee Newspaper on Return.

Attorney Joseph E. Morrison of this city, who returned a few days ago from Globe after spending several days there looking into the interests of the local stockholders in the new Cananea & Globe company, which was floated by Mitchell brothers and associates a short time ago in New York, through the instrumentality of Mr. Morrison, has great things to say of Globe and her progress toward becoming one of the powerful mining centers of the territory, says the Bisbee Miner.

"Globe has come out wonderfully," said he, "even since my last visit to the city. Everyone is busy and all seem to be working for the good of the town and to place it where it will be a power.

"Many improvements are under way there, the one in which I am especially interested, the new smelter of the Cananea & Globe Development company, being prominent among them. Grading for this building and the furnaces has already been completed and work of erecting the superstructure will be commenced shortly. Just how long it will take to complete the smelter is a hard thing to say, as the material is all on the road to Globe now, but on account of the car shortage and the generally congested condition all over the country, it would be hard to state when the material would arrive. It is probable, however, that the smelter will be finished by the middle of spring.

"Globe, like Bisbee, is suffering at present from a fuel famine. I heard rumors of various kinds about the situation while I was there, but in the main it seems to be no worse and possibly not quite as bad as the situation here. All the mines and smelters are operating and that's all that can be said about it.

"The town, like all the rest of Arizona, seems to be prospering mightily under the present high price of copper and the opening of spring will without doubt be marked by great activity in mining circles. From information I received while there I believe that several mining companies will start operations as soon as they can do so with any promise of continued good weather. Numerous prospectors are out in the field and several deals of large proportions are reported to be waiting for the opening of spring to be consummated.

"The whole district looks good and there is no doubt in my mind that it is to be considered as one of the coming districts of Arizona and of the world."
