LEMON COUPLE AGAIN JAILED

Couple Who Will Be Tried Here in the United States Court as Accomplices to Phil Rapier Later Give Bond at Tombstone and Are Released.

The following dispatch from Tombstone tells of the re-arresting of Mr. and Mrs. Lemon, who are on bond to appear for trial in the United States court in Globe next month:

James Lemon and wife, Mattie Lemon, are again inmates of the county jail as a result of several indictments found against them by the last United States grand jury, charging them with uttering and passing forged checks of the United States government. It will be remembered that Lemon and his wife were arrested in Bisbee at the time E. P. Rapier was arrested on the charge of stealing the book of government checks from one of the officials at the Roosevelt dam. Rapier was convicted in the district court of having passed one of the forged checks in Tombstone on A. Wentworth and J. M. Speck. After being indicted he entered a plea of guilty and was sentenced to serve a term of seven years in Yuma. After he had been arrested in this county the grand jury in session in Graham county returned thirteen indictments against Rapier and two each against Lemon and his wife. They were arrested and released on a bond to appear before the United States court in Tombstone in February. The indictments returned against them here charges them with forging and uttering the forged checks in Pearce, on the Pearce Mercantile company. The bond in each of these cases has been fixed in the sum of \$2,000 for each of them. The cases will come up for trial at the next term of the United States court.

Lemon and his wife were arrested at Pearce on Saturday by Deputy United States Marshal Clark and brought here pending the furnishing of the necessary bond.

A later dispatch says later the same afternoon bond was given by the two defendants in the sum of \$2,000, and they were ordered discharged from custody. The bond was arranged through a securities company.

SUICIDES IN TOMBSTONE

Wife of Former Miner of Globe Kills Herself at Tombstone—Wanted to Take a Dose of Morphine—Wanted to Leave "Earthly Cares Behind."

A dispatch from Tombstone dated the 8th says: Mrs. James Griffith, a resident of this city for the past three years, and at one time a resident of Bisbee, committed suicide this afternoon between the hours of 4 and 5 o'clock, by taking a dose of morphine. The woman left a note by her bedside in which she stated that she was unhappy and had at last decided to leave all earthly cares behind her.

At the time of taking the morphine with suicidal intent, her husband, who is a miner, was at work at the Tombstone shaft. He was quickly notified and hurried to the bedside of his dying wife, but she expired before he reached her. The unconscious body was discovered by roomers in the house, who summoned Dr. Hugarit. A stomach pump was applied, but all efforts to save the woman's life were unavailing and she died in a few moments after the doctor arrived.

The family came here from Colorado about a few years ago. Mr. Griffith is a miner and recently returned from Globe. During his absence, and prior to that time, Mrs. Griffith has been running a lodging house at the corner of Fourth and Bruce streets, the scene of the suicide today.

TWO ELECTION CONTESTS FAIL TO OUST WINNERS

In sustaining the demurrer of the defendant in the election contest of R. P. Talbot versus R. E. Morrison, involving the office of district attorney in Yavapai county, Judge R. E. Sloan of the district court thereby upheld the right of Morrison to the office.

In the opinion of the court Talbot had no ground of action, which he based upon the failure of the board of supervisors to designate the polling place for North Prescott.

It was contended by Talbot that returns from that precinct should be thrown out. The court held that the election board was not guilty of malconduct in receiving the votes and in counting them.

The decision also disposes of the case of Roland Mosher against J. C. Bradbury, which was of identical character, for the office of county recorder.

The contest of George Hardiker for the justice of the peace office in Douglas was decided in favor of Ben Rice, Democrat, the court not finding that any fraud had been committed.

STATEHOOD PREDICTION

Delegation Mark Smith on Return to Washington Says that Arizona Will Enter the Union in Four or Five Years as a Single State.

When the joint statehood bill was being discussed last winter one of the most bitter opponents of it was Marcus A. Smith, the delegate from Arizona. He fought the proposition making Arizona a state jointly with New Mexico and after it was defeated returned to his constituents and engaged in the fight in the territory, which terminated in an overwhelming vote against joint statehood. He took his seat in the house of representatives on the opening day of this congress, but soon left for Jackson Springs, Tenn., for a rest, and did not return to Washington until last Thursday.

"I believe that within four or five years we shall have a law providing separate statehood for both Arizona and New Mexico," said Delegate Smith upon his return. "It is inevitable that the developed resources and increased population of each of the territories will demand it. One county and many towns in Arizona have doubled their population in the past five years and it is safe to predict that the entire territory will in half a decade have more than 400,000 people, instead of the 200,000 it has now."

"Meanwhile, Arizona has a greater wealth and produces more per capita than any state or territory in the union. It offers splendid opportunities to young men of integrity and ability. It is a farming country, has a great future, furnishes a climate that stimulates men to do things, and has a social atmosphere where a man is honored for his true worth alone, and where every man gets a square deal."

"The president used to be very popular in the southwest, but since his stand for joint statehood, which the people of Arizona repudiated almost to a man, his popularity has waned. From what I can learn, I don't think he is so popular on the Pacific coast, either. I am with the members from that section in their attitude toward the Japanese."

RANGER VICTIM IS IDENTIFIED

Man Shot and Killed by Ranger Jeff Kidder at Douglas Proves to Be Tom Woods, Well Known as Gambler—Came to Douglas from Texas Town.

The mysterious party shot a week ago near the railroad roundhouse at Douglas by Ranger Jeff Kidder and whose body has lain ever since at an undertaking parlor for identification, has at last been identified. His name is Tom T. Wood and his name appears on the city register of Douglas as a registered voter. Wood is a native of the state of Georgia, lived several years in various towns in Texas, notably Toyah and Amarillo, has tended bar in Douglas, gambled, carpentered and done other odd jobs there for several years. And with all this the body lay for nearly a week in the undertaking parlors awaiting identification.
