## NEW TOWNSITE AT MIAMI FLAT

### Local Company Formed to Found New Town on Railroad Extension

A company has been formed, the evident purpose of which is to start a new town which will be the main station on the extension of the Gila Valley, Globe & Northern railroad to mines north and west of the city. The company is incorporated as the Miami Land & Improvement company and from what can be learned it has secured valuable surface rights of mining claims and the title to other ground which has been taken up as agricultural land, all of which will constitute a new townsite, which should be a winner. The new town will be located about four miles from Globe at the end of Miami Flat and within easy distance from the Black Warrior, Keystone, Live Oak, Inspiration, Eureka and other mines in that vicinity.

The incorporators of the new company are C. D. Reppy of Safford; C. D. Stephens of Fort Thomas; S. H. Van Slyck, J. C. Phillipson, W. L. Hagen and J. H. Davis of Globe. The following are the officers of the company: S. H. Van Slyck, president; J. H. Davis, vice president; J. C. Phillipson, secretary; and C. D. Stephens, treasurer. The capitalization of the company is \$16,000 and it will be a close corporation.

## CUMMINS OUT FOR ROOSEVELT

### Iowa Governor Thinks President Should Recall Former Determination

DES MOINES, Iowa, April 24.—In a letter addressed to George E. Bowers of Orange, Iowa, Governor Cummins declares that Roosevelt should withdraw the statement that he will not accept a renomination.

"There is a great deal being said," writes the governor, "with regard to the candidate for president, but vastly more important that we succeed in announcing a platform that will be expressive of our purposes than is now to determine who the candidate shall be. Personally, I believe Roosevelt's plain duty is to withdraw his former statement and say that under the demonstration now made and the evident state of public mind he will accept another nomination if tendered to him with practical unanimity."

### INJURED IN RUNAWAY

Mrs. Kennedy Has a Miraculous Escape from Death Yesterday

Mrs. Kennedy, wife of Dr. Kennedy of the Old Dominion medical staff, had a terrible experience yesterday and a miraculous escape from death. She accompanied the doctor to the hospital of the company yesterday morning and remained in the buggy while the doctor made his usual morning visit. The high spirited animal attached to the vehicle in some manner rubbed the bridle and bit loose and suddenly bolted down the road. The reins were useless and Mrs. Kennedy could do nothing but scream for help.

The maddened beast dashed over the winding road and at the junction of the old abandoned road and the one now in use the horse swerved, seemingly undecided which road to take, but, fortunately for the sole occupant of the buggy, he decided on the former and circled the fence of Superintendent Berrey's residence, bolting down hill and into the tailing bed at the bottom of the canyon. He stumbled and went to his knees just at the edge and here Mrs. Kennedy attempted to jump and partly fell into the rocks and the rig went on into the sand, where the horse was powerless and easily captured.

Mrs. Kennedy was found lying unconscious by a dozen men who had seen the runaway and had rushed from all directions to the rescue, expecting to find the lady mangled and dead. She after a time regained consciousness and was taken to the hospital for treatment, and still remains there, having sustained injuries to the hip and spine.

If the runaway horse had chosen the right hand or new road instead of the one he did take, Mrs. Kennedy would certainly have been killed, as the road is steep and full of abrupt turns.
