**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE SHANLEY CATTLE COMPANY**

Know All Men by These Presents: That we, W. G. Shanley, George Shanley and Sarah Rose, all of Globe, Gila County, Arizona, citizens of the United States of America, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and we hereby certify, acknowledge and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

**ARTICLE I.** The name of this company shall be and is the SHANLEY CATTLE COMPANY.

**ARTICLE II.** The principal place for transacting the business of this corporation shall be in the City of Globe, Gila County, Arizona Territory, and branch offices may be maintained at such other places as its Board of Directors may from time to time select.

**ARTICLE III.** The general nature of business, pursuit and enterprise, proposed to be transacted by this corporation is as follows:

- (a) To breed, raise, buy and otherwise acquire, own, hold, sell and deal in horses, cattle, goats and hogs and all the products thereof, and engage in a general live stock and cattle business, and do all things consistent therewith or incidental thereto.
- (b) To purchase or otherwise acquire, own, hold, sell, rent, lease and otherwise deal in cattle ranges, ranches, town lots, mining claims and other real estate.
- (c) To engage in a wholesale and retail butcher business and to acquire and maintain slaughter houses, butcher shops and all things incidental thereto.
- (d) To purchase, develop or otherwise acquire water and water rights and construct roads, wells, reservoirs and pumping plants.
- (e) To buy, sell, own, hold and deal in the corporate stock of other corporations and other collateral, notes and securities.
- (f) To sell, convey, bond, lease, mortgage or otherwise at any time to dispose of any or all of its property of every character whatsoever.

**ARTICLE IV.** The amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars, divided into Ten Thousand (10,000) shares of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars each, such stock to be issued when fully paid for in services or property, from time to time as the Board of Directors shall authorize. Such stock, when issued, to be non-assessable.

**ARTICLE V.** The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing in the office of the Secretary of the Territory of Arizona, of a certified copy of these Articles of Incorporation and the termination shall be twenty-five years thereafter.

**ARTICLE VI.** The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of five Directors, who shall be shareholders. A majority of said Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and the first directors shall be W. G. Shanley, George Shanley, Nan Shanley, Sarah Rose and Maud Waters, all of Globe, Arizona, who shall hold office until 10 o'clock A. M. of the second Tuesday of May, 1908, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Thereafter, the Directors annually, at a stockholders' meeting to be held at the office of the Company at Globe, Arizona, on the second Tuesday of May, at ten o'clock A. M., in each year, shall be elected and qualified for the term of office commencing on the second Tuesday in May in each year.

The Board of Directors shall have power at any time to fill vacancies therein.

**ARTICLE VII.** The officers of this corporation shall be President, General Manager, Secretary and Treasurer. The President, General Manager, Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors from their own number at the first meeting of the Board following the annual election of the said Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may, in the discretion of the Board of Directors, be held by one person.

**ARTICLE VIII.** The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation is at any time to subject itself, shall in no case exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars.

**ARTICLE IX.** The Board of Directors shall adopt By-Laws for this corporation which may be altered, repeated or amended by said Board.

**ARTICLE X.** The private property of the stockholders of this corporation shall be exempt from liability for the corporate debts of this corporation.
