ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF MIAMI LAND AND IMPROVEMENT COMPANY
Know All Men by These Presents: That we, C. D. Reppy, of Safford, County of Graham, Territory of Arizona; C. D. Stephens, of Fort Thomas, County of Graham, Territory of Arizona; J. C. Phillipson, W. L. Hagen, J. H. Davis, S. H. Van Slyck, of Globe, County of Gila, Territory of Arizona, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and for this purpose we do hereby declare and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I.

The names of the incorporators are C. D. Reppy, C. D. Stephens, J. C. Phillipson, W. L. Hagen, J. H. Davis and S. H. Van Slyck. The name of this corporation shall be and is MIAMI LAND AND IMPROVEMENT COMPANY.

ARTICLE II.

The principal place of the transaction of the business of this corporation shall be and is in Globe, County of Gila, Territory of Arizona, at which place the meetings of the stockholders and directors shall be held, provided that branch offices may be established at such places, either within or without the Territory of Arizona, as may at any time be determined by the Board of Directors, where the meetings of the stockholders and directors may be held, and at such places any and all business may be transacted which may not be in conflict with the laws of the Territory of Arizona, or the laws of any such State or Territory where the branch offices may be established.

ARTICLE III.

The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation shall be as follows, to wit:

To do a general real estate business and in that connection to acquire by purchase, location or in any otherwise whatsoever real estate of all classes, agricultural lands, mines and mining claims and mining property; to sweep, hold, develop, improve and otherwise use the same and to sell, exchange, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, lease and let the same; to lay out townships and to deal in and with the town lots and property so laid out; to make contracts to purchase or otherwise acquire real estate, mines and mining claims and property and to make contracts to dispose of the same; to erect, construct and maintain buildings and improvements of all kinds and character and to lease and let the same and collect the rents therefor; to conduct stores and to engage in the mercantile business; to erect, operate and maintain boarding houses, lodging houses and hotels; to deal in and with all kinds of personal property, stocks, bonds and securities; to acquire, hold, operate, maintain and dispose of electric lighting, power and water plants, gas works; sewer systems and street railways; to borrow money and execute notes, bonds, mortgages and other evidences of indebtedness to secure the same; to loan money on recognized securities; to acquire, hold and dispose of franchises; to engage in the abstract business, and in general to do and perform any and all acts and things necessary to conduct the affairs of this corporation.

ARTICLE IV.

The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date upon which these Articles of Incorporation are filed in the office of the county Recorder of Gila County, and a certified copy thereof filed in the office of the Territorial Auditor of Arizona. The termination of this corporation shall be twenty-five years from and after the date of filing the certified copy of the said Articles in the office of the Auditor of the Territory of Arizona.

ARTICLE V.

The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of five Directors, elected annually by and from the stockholders of this corporation. The first annual meeting for this purpose and for the transaction of any other business that may properly come before the stockholders shall be held on the second Tuesday in October of the year 1907, and such annual meetings of the stockholders shall thereafter be held on the same day in each succeeding year.

ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness to which this corporation shall at any time subject itself shall be and is hereby fixed at the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars.

ARTICLE VII.
