 A Cuban asked the owner if the birds were not hot with the hoods on. The owner admitted that they were, whereupon the Cuban took the hoods off two of the birds.
 The two promptly got away, and then the fun commenced. Everybody on board the steamer engaged in pursuit of them. It had to be conducted with great caution, as a kick from an ostrich is a serious matter.
 The ostriches put up a game fight, but were finally recaptured, tied up, and taken ashore. Then the Allemania sailed for Vera Cruz.—Havana cable to the New York Sun.

COPPERS ACTIVE BUT SELL OFF

Metal Higher in London Yesterday—This Caused Better Feeling in London—Close, However, Was Little Weak—Bull Tips on Big Coppers.

 GLOBE, May 1.—Walker Brothers of New York say: The strength today at the opening was steady and strong. Strength in coppers was the feature. Trading was mostly professional and there was little commission house business. In the afternoon prices sold off quite sharply. Crop rumors were the chief factors. Market was weak at the close. There was a slight advance in call money rates, which was very natural on the first day of the month. This caused traders to take selling side. Look for traders market for rest of week.
 Paine of Boston says: A sharp rise in the London copper market this morning caused a better feeling in coppers. High priced stocks were in good demand and Tamarack, Calumet & Arizona, Quincy and North Butte showed good advances. The Quincy directors meet next week and will declare at least \$4.50 and predict much further advance in the stock.

 The metal market is getting stronger and all stocks are going up with it. We would think most any good stock bought now will show a good profit in the near future. Tamarack opened at \$112 and closed \$120.50 bid today. Oscuela today opened at \$125 and sold up to \$132, showing that good stocks can advance in a short time.

ORDINANCE NO. TWENTY-TWO
 An Ordinance Regulating the Number of Saloons and Their Location.
 Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Globe: SECTION I.
 That no saloon or place where intoxicating liquors are retailed to be consumed upon the premises, shall be opened or maintained at any place, in the City of Globe, other than at those places now licensed to retail intoxicating liquors, without the consent of two-thirds of all the property owners in the block where the proposed saloon is desired to be maintained.

SECTION II.
 That licenses shall not be issued for more than forty-five (45) saloons to be maintained in the City of Globe at any time.

SECTION III.
 That this ordinance shall not apply to houses of prostitution.

ORDINANCE NO. TWENTY-FIVE
 An Ordinance Amending Ordinance Number Seventeen.
 Be it ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Globe: SECTION I.
 Section III of Ordinance Number Seventeen of the City of Globe is hereby amended to read as follows:
SECTION III.
 It shall be unlawful for any person to maintain within the said fire limits any tent or canvas covered building, or other structure with canvas or cloth roof or lining, or any stove pipes running through any side or roof openly in any building; nor shall any person build or erect any building or addition to any building within said fire limits, of any material other than brick, stone, cement, or other non-combustible material.

SECTION II.
 All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
SECTION III.
 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. Passed and approved the 25th day of April, A. D. 1907.
