

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE GLOBE WHOLESALE MEAT COMPANY

Know All Men by These Presents: That we, the undersigned and herein after designated incorporators, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming and creating a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and therefore do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I. The names of the incorporators are: E. D. Reed, Denis Murphy, Joe Ryan, James Pitts, William Gaskill, Pat Rose, J. N. Porter, William Ryan, J. J. Moloney, Howard T. Wayne, L. H. Brown, G. C. Simmons, Fred Jones, A. J. McKinnon, George Rose and S. F. Sullenberger, all of Globe, Gila County, Arizona, and citizens of the United States of America.

ARTICLE II. The name of this corporation is and shall be THE GLOBE WHOLESALE MEAT COMPANY.

ARTICLE III. The principal place for the transaction of business by this corporation is and shall be the City of Globe, Gila County, Territory of Arizona, at which place the meetings of the Directors and Stockholders shall be had and held, but branch offices for conducting and transacting business may be maintained at other places, as its Board of Directors may from time to time designate and select.

ARTICLE IV. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation is as follows: To do a general wholesale and retail butcher business; to deal in, buy and sell all kinds of fresh, salted and cured meats, live and dressed poultry and produce of all kinds; to deal in all kinds of general merchandise, and to maintain stores and offices for that purpose; to erect, operate and maintain cold-storage plants, and plants for the manufacture of ice; to operate and maintain bottling plants and deal in the products thereof; to erect, operate and maintain electric lighting and power plants; to own, buy, sell and deal generally in real estate of all kinds, including mines and mining stocks; to issue bonds, debentures, mortgages, or other obligations and secure the same by mortgage or lien on any of the property, franchises or rights of this corporation; to deal in, buy, sell or otherwise acquire the stocks, bonds or securities of other corporations, firms or individuals, as well as of this corporation; to raise, buy or breed, and otherwise acquire, own or hold and deal in, all kinds of live stock of every description or character, and conduct a general live stock and cattle business, and for that purpose to own, control and acquire cattle ranges and ranch properties of every kind or description; to own, operate and control hotels, restaurants and boarding houses; to buy, sell and deal in all kinds of personal property, wares and merchandise; to act as agent or broker for the purchase or sale of real or personal property, including live stock.

ARTICLE V. The capital stock of this corporation is and shall be the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), divided into fifteen hundred shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each, and when issued shall be first fully paid for in cash, or property of an equivalent cash value, and such shares of stock, when so issued, shall thereafter be non-assessable.

ARTICLE VI. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of a certified copy of these Articles of Incorporation in the office of the Auditor of the Territory of Arizona, at Phoenix, Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years from the date of the filing of said certified copy in said office of the said Auditor, unless renewed for a greater length of time, as provided by law.

ARTICLE VII. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors, consisting of not less than three, nor more than fifteen, to be elected annually by and from among the stockholders, and the number decided upon and elected at such annual election shall constitute the number of Directors for that year. The first annual meeting of Stockholders for the election of Directors and transaction of other business as may come before them shall be held on the second Tuesday of April 1908, and such annual meeting shall be held on the same day of each succeeding year thereafter.

ARTICLE VIII. The officers of this corporation shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and General Manager, and such other minor officers as the Board of Directors may see proper to create, and the offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be filled by one and the same person, and all of said officers are to be elected by and from among the Board of Directors. Until such Board of Directors shall have been elected, as provided for in Article VII, the following stockholders herein are hereby designated and appointed and shall constitute the Board of Directors, viz:

Pat Rose, Alfred Kinney, William Ryan, Fred Jones, J. N. Porter, Denis Murphy, E. D. Reed, S. F. Sullenberger, and Joe Ryan; and until such time, the following persons are hereby named, constituted and appointed as the officers of this corporation, viz: Denis Murphy, President; Pat Rose, Vice-President; S. F. Sullenberger, Secretary and Treasurer, and E. D. Reed, General Manager.

ARTICLE IX. The Board of Directors shall have power and authority to fill all vacancies which may occur in said Board by resignation or otherwise, and shall adopt a corporate seal, and such by-laws as they deem proper and necessary for conducting the affairs of the corporation. The Board of Directors shall also have full power and authority, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board, to borrow money for the use and benefit of the corporation, from time to time as they deem necessary, and to authorize the execution and issuance of the corporation notes, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness, and to secure same by mortgage or other

lien upon the corporation property, franchises or other assets of every character whatsoever. And the Board of Directors shall also have full power and authority upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board, to purchase, sell, bond, lease, mortgage, or otherwise encumber or dispose of any or all of the property, rights, franchises, or assets of this corporation, and to execute and deliver all necessary deeds, bills of sale, or other evidences of conveyances thereto.

ARTICLE X. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation shall at any time subject itself shall be the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00).

ARTICLE XI. Private property of the stockholders in this corporation shall be exempt from liability for the payment of corporate debts.
