



BUILDING BLACKWELL'S ISLAND BRIDGE.

Work is now advancing rapidly on the construction of the Blackwell's Island bridge in New York city. This great structure, which spans the East river by crossing Blackwell's Island 125 feet above the ground, is of the cantilever type. The interesting method of construction is shown in the illustration. The other two bridges across the East river are suspension bridges. This cantilever structure will be, including its approaches to the street level in Manhattan and Long Island, nearly two miles in length. It will have tracks for elevated and surface electric lines, a wide roadway for vehicles and two sidewalks for pedestrians. The bridge is to cost about \$18,000,000.
