## NOTHING DOING IN THE MARKET

Continued Decline with Nothing in Sight that Looks Good—Bank Statement Not Good, but Has no Effect on the Market—No Bids for Stocks.

GLOBE, June 1.—The end of the week sees over twenty of the leading issues selling below prices reached during the panic of March 14. There was absolutely nothing doing today in the market. Many of the stocks had no bid at all, while other bids were at least a point under the last previous sale. No stock was pressed for sale, but most of the quotations were lower than yesterday. Paine of Boston thinks Quincy, Greene-Canaan, Copper Range and North Butte are cheap at present prices.

Old Dominion fell sharply in the general decline, closing weak at \$46.50. Calumet & Arizona sold off three points from the opening. Bids of \$10.50 for Globe Consolidated and \$2.37 for Superior & Boston failed to locate any of the stock. In spite of bull tips on Nipissing, it sold off a point from yesterday's high mark, closing at \$12.37. Walker Brothers of New York say: The market was very quiet today and weak. There was a general movement by professional bears to sell the market off and catch stops. The active list was led by Union Pacific and became quite weak, as there seemed to be little attempt to support. The bank statement was not good and had little or no effect. Before the close prices became steady, but showed little inclination to advance. We look for a trader's market next week—one easily affected by crop reports.

## STOCKS CONTINUE TO DROP LOWER

The Market Shows Little or No Change—Stocks Are Affected by the Numerous Bonds Placed on the Market.

GLOBE, June 1.—The stock market was weaker today than any time during the week, but it was expected. Monday should show improvement, with an upward tendency for the week.

The continued weakness of the stock market has led many to believe that there is significant personal history back of it. They think they see signs that important interests have been obliged to liquidate. Names mentioned are those of capitalists whose financial solvency is beyond all question, but who are believed to have extended themselves too much. There is little to say about the market, but that the good stocks are low and should be profitable investments to investors at this time. While the heavy liquidations continue, however, we cannot look for much of an advance but there should be some end to this soon. The volume of bonds that is continuously put on the market has a great deal to do with the present prices of stocks.

With the easy money, however, this should be soon relieved.
