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**Bertillon's New Invention**  
 M. Bertillon, chief of the intelligence department of the Paris detective service, who is known as the inaugurator of the system of identification of criminals by finger prints, has just perfected an apparatus which it is hoped will greatly help in the problem of the identification of arrested criminals. M. Bertillon has the prisoner or the body for the system is also to be used in the identification of the dead—photographed lying full length on a table with the head slightly raised. The camera, in which is a special combination lens invented by M. Bertillon's assistant, M. Berthiot, is placed directly above the object to be photographed, and at a certain fixed distance. By means of a very delicate apparatus the distance from the lens to an imaginary plane level with a point half way between the orifice of the ear and the corner of the eye is measured, and from this distance is reckoned the scale of the photograph—the number of times smaller than the original. The photograph, when used in comparison with a suspect, is placed in an apparatus which is almost the reverse of the camera. It is placed at the given distance from the lens, and at the same time a transparent scale is moved into focus on the same plane. Reading on this scale, the detective is able to establish the exact measurement of the features of the prisoner.—London Times.
