A Tucson paper says: It is announced that Superintendent W. A. McGovern has been transferred from the Tucson division to the Coast service.

The announcement came as a surprise and although it is a decided promotion, Mr. McGovern is not backward in saying that his personal preference would be for Tucson, since he has formed a strong attachment for the city during his two and one-half years' residence here.

Mr. McGovern succeeded Thomas R. Jones and assumed charge in November, 1904. Previous to his appointment he filled the position of assistant superintendent of the Los Angeles division.

During his incumbency there have been very marked improvements upon the five hundred miles of road under his charge.

The relaying of the division with heavy steel has been completed and practically all wooden structures in the way of trestles, bridges or culverts have been replaced with iron and concrete.

Big Cattle Shipments

W. M. Noel of the Noel & Hysham company, owning the Four-Bar ranch and cattle ranges in the Sulphur Springs valley, Ed Moore and other cattle owners of this valley, have contracted the sale of 6,000 head of cattle which are to be shipped to Colorado and the northwestern states from Wilcox, says the Tombstone Prospector. This shipment will include 1,700 heifers purchased by Noel & Hysham from the Greene Cattle company.

Some of these cattle have already been shipped and the remainder will go forward as fast as the required cars can be secured at Wilcox. Already there has been delay in furnishing the cars and it is not known just when they will be received.

It is believed this shipment will be the largest made from the territory this year and it illustrates the importance of the cattle industry in this section of Arizona.
