ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of the AMERICAN GOLD AND COPPER COMPANY

Know All Men by These Presents:

That we, the undersigned, associate ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

FIRST: That the names of the incorporators are O. W. Thompson, Wm. C. Buege and J. G. Naquin, and the name of the corporation shall be AMERICAN GOLD AND COPPER COMPANY and its principal place of business is and shall be at Globe, Arizona.

SECOND: The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by said corporation shall be as follows: Locate, purchase or acquire otherwise mineral lands, including lode and placer claims, and lands necessary to operate the same; the erection of sampling, reduction and other works necessary to treat the ores; the disposal of the mines and other property of the corporation in the manner provided in by-laws of said corporation; the operation and development of the mines, acquisition of necessary roads, lines and machinery and other equipment generally used in mining business, and to do and transact all kinds of business which may be transacted by a natural person.

THIRD: The capital stock of said corporation shall be Five Hundred Thousand Dollars, divided into Five Hundred Thousand shares of the par value of One Dollar per share. Such stock may be paid for in cash, property or service, upon such terms and conditions as shall be provided for by the board of directors.

FOURTH: The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the day of the filing of a certified copy of its Articles of Incorporation with the Territorial Auditor, and with the County Recorder of Gila County, Arizona, and the corporation shall endure for a term of twenty-five years from the date of said filing.

FIFTH: The above-named incorporators shall constitute the Board of Directors, who shall hold office until the First Annual Meeting of the Stockholders to be held on the 29th day of June, 1907, or until their successors are elected and qualified, and at the first meeting of said board of directors, they shall provide and adopt by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of this corporation, and the acquisition and disposal of shares and other property of this corporation.

SIXTH: The highest amount of indebtedness to which this corporation shall subject itself at any one time shall be Ten Thousand Dollars.

SEVENTH: The private property of the stockholders of this corporation shall be forever exempt from liability for debts of this corporation.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE GLOBE AND LOST-GULCH SILVER-COPPER MINES COMPANY

Know All Men by These Presents:

That we, whose hands are affixed hereto, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and for this purpose we do hereby declare and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

Article 1. The names of the incorporators are M. E. Brooke and J. A. Myrberg and the name of the corporation shall be The Globe and Lost-Gulch Silver-Copper Mines Company.

The principal place within the Territory of Arizona in which the business of said corporation is to be transacted is Globe, Gila County, Arizona, and the corporation may establish branch offices either within or without the Territory of Arizona where meetings of the Board of Directors may be held, and the principal place outside of said Territory is Denver, State of Colorado, where meetings may be held and business transacted not in conflict with the laws of Arizona.

Article 2. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation is as follows, to-wit: To purchase, own and operate all kinds of mines and mining property; to locate mining property; to control and operate all kinds of water mains; to locate, own, operate, lease, buy and sell any plants for the treatment of ores and bullion; to buy and sell ores and bullion; to operate electric light and power plants; to erect and lay lines of wires for conducting light and power and messages; and to sell and dispose of light and power; to build and operate roads; to make contracts; to purchase, lease, bond, locate or otherwise acquire, own, sell or otherwise dispose of, pledge, mortgage, hypothecate and deal in real estate and any and all kinds of personal property; mines, mining claims, oil lands, coal lands, mineral lands, oil, gas, coal, shale, asphaltum, petroleum, asbestos, salt, water and water rights and machinery, and to work, mine, explore, operate and develop the same; and in general to do all things necessary to the proper conduct of the business of this corporation in the Territory and elsewhere, not inconsistent with the laws of the United States and the Territory of Arizona.

Article 3. The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be one million dollars (\$1,000,000) divided into one million shares of the par value of one dollar (\$1.00) each. At such times

as the Board of Directors may by resolution direct, said capital stock shall be paid into this corporation either in cash or by the sale and transfer to it, of real or personal property for the uses and purposes of said corporation, in payment for which shares of the capital stock of said corporation may be issued, and the capital stock so issued shall thereupon and thereby become and be fully paid up and non-assessable, and the judgment of the directors as to the value of the property purchased shall be conclusive.

Article 4. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of a certified copy of these Articles of Incorporation in the office of the Territorial Auditor, and of the Recorder of Gila County, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter.

Article 5. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors, of not more than five directors, and the directors may adopt By-laws for the corporation, and the following named persons shall constitute the Board of Directors until their successors are elected and qualified: M. E. Brooke, J. A. Myrberg, V. G. Hills.

Thereafter the Board of Directors shall be elected among the stockholders on the last Tuesday in March of each year. The officers of said corporation until their successors are elected shall be:

President: V. G. Hills;
Vice-President: J. A. Myrberg;
Secretary: M. E. Brooke;
Treasurer: M. E. Brooke;

Article 6. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability, direct or contingent to which this corporation is at any time subject shall be three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000), which amount does not exceed two thirds the amount of capital stock.

Article 7. The private property of the stockholders of this corporation shall be exempt from corporate debts of any kind whatsoever.

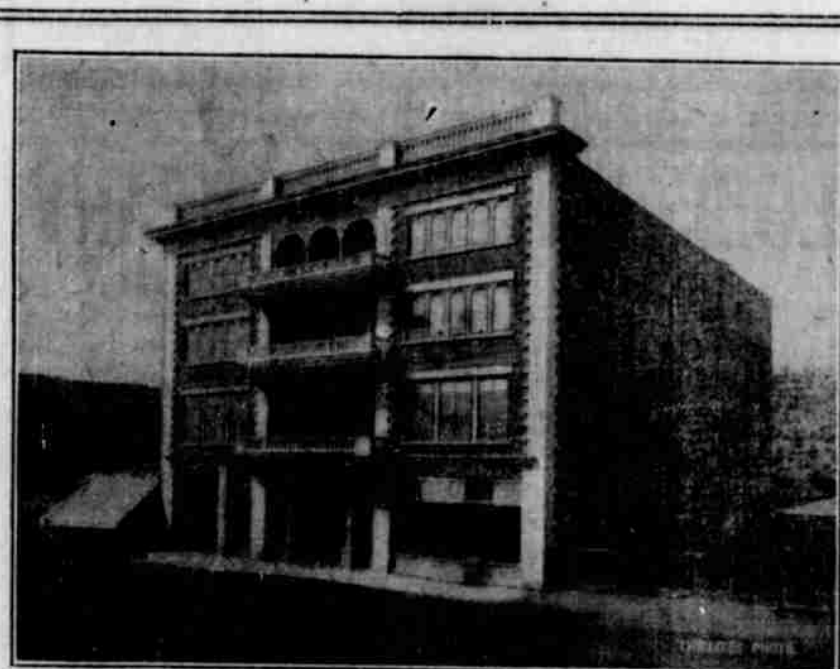
