APACHE INDIANS WILL GIVE A DEVIL DANCE

Arrangements have been completed to have the Apache Indians give their devil and war dance at the ball park Sunday evening.

After considerable time and trouble in "rounding up" some of the leading singers and the Clurney-erk-lighte, the Apaches have consented to come to Globe and join in the worship of their God before an audience. They hesitated in coming, as they have already had one devil dance and one sun dance at Wheatfields and the chief would not move his camp unless given permission to continue their worship till sunrise on the following day. So, as is their usual custom, the devil dance will begin at 8 o'clock and the war dance as early as the moon, according to their belief, will permit, which will be about 11 o'clock. The dances will both be given in the usual dress, and according to the custom of the Apaches, the bow and arrow and gun will be used in the war dance.

Ski-a-u-lighti, an old Apache, will sing and have charge of the war dance and will wear the war cap of feathers, which he says was worn by Ski-uk-shin over two hundred years ago. Chief Clurney-erk-lighte has invited all the Indians of the neighboring camps to attend and worship with them, and he says unless the weather prohibits there will be several hundred Indians witness the worship.

The park management has made arrangements to furnish wood for the fire and also a beef for the occasion.

Copper had quite a sharp break in the London market, spot being £2 lower at £92 and futures £1 5s lower at £86. Locally nominally unchanged with Lake at 21.00 to 22.00; Electrolytic, 20.50 to 21.00; Casting, 20.00 to 20.50.
Lead was unchanged at 5.15 to 5.25 in the local market, but declined 10s to £20 in London.
Spelter was unchanged at £28 16s 2d in London, but weak at 5.95 to 6.00 locally.
