OLD DOMINION CAN CONTINUE DIVIDENDS

A director of the Old Dominion company says: "The Old Dominion company with its present high copper costs can pay \$1 per share per annum on 18-cent copper, but it could not do so on 15-cent copper. Our costs, however, are steadily decreasing, but unfortunately they are not decreasing in the same ratio as is the price of copper. In six months from now Old Dominion costs should be materially lower.

"We are now receiving 75 per cent of our sulphur requirements within the limits of the Globe camp and of this percentage 50 to 60 per cent is coming from the Old Dominion property. We have stopped the treatment of Nacozari concentrates and will soon stop using Greene Consolidated concentrates. We are receiving lump sulphides from California and from the Shattuck Arizona company.

"Our underground developments are showing steady improvement and in another month we will be down to the 10th level from a mine sunk from the 14th level crosscut."—Boston News Bureau.

Smith, a prominent politician of El Paso, Texas, who very recently resigned the postoffice at that city and gave as his reason that he had other pressing business; Major McClintock, postmaster at Phoenix; Governor Killeby, and several other prominent politicians of Phoenix.

Hitchcock came from New Mexico, where it is said he went to see Governor Curry inaugurated and to arrange for the adjustment of political matters in that territory. He stated to the newspaper men that his visit to Arizona and New Mexico is without any political significance; that he is simply taking a bird's-eye view of the west and attending to his postoffice duties.
