SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., August 19.—The case of the government against Dr. Perrin and Benson, charged with conspiring to defraud the United States of valuable lands in Tehama county, neared its conclusion this afternoon when United States District Attorney Devlin rendered a strong closing argument for the prosecution. The case may be submitted to the jury before night.
