FOUR DROWNED IN SACRAMENTO

Expert Swimmer Dragged Under by Three Persons He Tried to Save

SACRAMENTO, Cal., August 20.—Mrs. Charles White, her cousin, a girl about 18 years of age and the girl's brother, Charles Palen, and Manuel Greggs, were drowned in the Sacramento river this afternoon at a point about one block north of Rocky Point, on the Yolo side.

Greggs, who was an expert swimmer, lost his life in attempting to rescue his friend. At the time of the accident the party was in a duck boat endeavoring to reach the houseboat in which Mrs. White lived. The duck boat capsized.

Greggs witnessed the accident from the shore. He hastily pulled off his coat and plunged into the water in an endeavor to save Mrs. White and her relatives. He reached them in a few strokes, but was grabbed around the neck by the three drowning persons and dragged under the water.

The struggling people came to the surface once or twice when Greggs was fighting hard to beat off Mrs. White and her companions, who soon disappeared from sight.

Greggs' efforts to beat off Mrs. White were of little avail and he soon disappeared under the water. Mrs. White and her relatives were residents of Washington. Greggs was an expert swimmer and pined his vocation on the river for many years. The bodies have been recovered.
