GILA VALLEY TRAINS ON VERY LATE SCHEDULE

The passenger train due here Sunday evening did not arrive until 6 o'clock yesterday morning, leaving Bowie at 9 o'clock the previous evening. Last night the train was reported two hours late at first and at 10 o'clock was reported two hours later. At midnight the train dispatcher stated that it would not arrive until about 5 o'clock this morning. The cause of the delay seems to be somewhere between Fort Thomas and San Carlos, probably at milepost 87, where additional cribbing was required on the washed out bridge there. The train at 1 o'clock this morning had been stalled between these two stations for five hours. It left San Carlos at 2:4. The train leaves this morning at the usual time.
