The first business transacted was to allow a claim presented by the institution for the deaf, dumb and blind, at Berkeley, Cal., for the care of six Arizona inmates for the quarter ending October 1. The claim was \$450.

Certificates to teach in Arizona were granted to the graduates of schools and colleges as follows:

All of the applicants for certificates which were granted on college diplomas had to present proofs that they had completed one year's work in pedagogical studies in addition to their college work.

## FOUND RATTLER UNDER HIS BED

Tucson Man Awakened in the Stilly Hours of Night by a Familiar Buzzing, Finds Rattlesnake Under His Bed, Which He Kills.

## KIDNAPPED YOUTH SEEKS DAMAGES

Manuel Sarabia, Who Was Kidnaped and Taken Across the Mexican Line, Asks Those Responsible for Damages in the Sum of \$20,000.

Through his attorneys, Beumler & Parsons of Douglas, Manuel Sarabia has brought civil action against Antonio Maza, A. S. J. Shropshire, Sam Hayhurst, J. F. Dowdle, J. L. Stambaugh, Lee Thompson and the Title Guaranty & Insurance company of Scranton, Pa., for damages in the sum of \$20,000.

The complaint, after formally designating the official capacities of the officials who are included in the action, at length reviews the sensational happenings that were rowded into the life of the complainant, all of which are well known to the public at large. The facts in the case, which the attorneys review and make a portion of the complaint, are just such as have been developed by the newspapers in handling the Sarabia kidnaping case heretofore. ## ALL OVER THE TERRITORY

Mesa has produced a wonderful cow. She is the property of D. D. Smith and although she is only two and a half years old, she is capable of producing \$15.96 worth of butter a month. During the closing week of December she gave 35 pounds of milk per day, testing .655 butter fat. At this rate she would have given 1,050 pounds of milk in thirty days and at the test made produced 57.75 pounds of butter fat, which at 28 cents would have netted him \$15.96.

The vegetable men of Mesa have decided to plant a large quantity of the Bermuda white onions this season. These onions are said to be of mild strength and therefore especially desirable for table use. The seeds are grown in the Canary islands and imported to this country in large quantities. One of Mesa's growers has just received twenty pounds of this variety, fresh from the gardens, and will give the onion a thorough trial the coming season. The seed costs, laid down in Mesa, \$2.50 per pound, and it requires about four pounds to the acre.

D. D. Graham, whose headquarters are at Gallup, N. M., has been sent to Yuma by the government as special allotting agent for the Yuma Indians. He will be here six or eight months to locate each of the Yumas on the five acres of land due them. This is net and is exclusive of roads and canals. There are some six hundred of the Yumas, which means an allotment of about 3,000 acres of the reservation to them. Probably in all they will require 4,000 acres. This will leave the public about 13,000 acres of the reservation on which to settle. There will be nothing doing in this line until Mr. Graham has closed with all of the Indians.


