

**BROTHER OF MURDERED GOVERNOR SAYS WOMAN'S STORY IS A FABRICATION**  
**PHOENIX MAN HOLDS TAYLOR AND POWERS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KILLING**

**Says the Prosecution Will Be Continued as Long as There Is a Goebel Alive—'We Will Get Governor Taylor Sooner or Later,' He Says.**  
 PHOENIX, Ariz., September 26.—Justus Goebel of Phoenix, a brother of the late Governor Goebel of Kentucky, commenting on an affidavit made by a woman in Richmond, Ind., saying that Governor Goebel was killed by Turner Igo at the instigation of the son of John Sanderson, says the story is a pure fabrication. He says the facts set forth in the affidavit are so at variance with the proved facts that they cannot be considered. He denies that the prosecution of anybody is political persecution and says the only persons interested in the prosecution are himself and his brother, Arthur, of Cincinnati, "and such friends as may aid them in avenging the death of Governor Goebel. He has no desire to convict an innocent man, thus shielding the murderer, and to that end he has followed every clue reported, each of which, if not utterly discredited, was traced back to Taylor and Powers."  
 Continuing, he said: "The prosecution which has been conducted without abatement of enthusiasm for eight years, will be conducted as long as there is a Goebel, young or old, alive, or until the guilty parties have been brought to justice. We will get Governor Taylor sooner or later. He cannot always find an asylum in Indiana."

**WANTED TO IMPORT BIRDS FROM HERE**  
 CALIFORNIA SENATOR DESIRED TO STOCK TURKEY, BUT RUN UP AGAINST AN OBSTACLE.  
 State Senator Willis of San Bernardino county, California, had a plan on foot to have the California game commission to import a number of wild turkeys from Arizona to stock the San Bernardino mountain reserve, but was frustrated in his plan by the game warden of the territory, Mr. P. L. Robinson of Phoenix, who mailed him a copy of the Arizona game laws that prevent the catching of wild turkeys in Arizona or having them in captivity.  
 The following article, which is taken from the Los Angeles Examiner, shows that the senator has now devised another plan of getting his turkeys, and was dated at San Bernardino on September 21:  
 "Told that his plan to have the state game and fish commission import wild turkeys from Arizona to stock the San Bernardino mountain reserve has been nipped in the bud by the game laws of the territory, the resourceful Senator Willis has discovered a new source of supply. But he is not admitting that the laws of Arizona prevent the shipment of wild turkeys out of the state for propagation. However it is best to take the birds where there will be the least trouble.  
 "The senator has interviewed William van Slyke, a local mining man, who this morning returned from Matatlan on the west coast of Mexico. Van Slyke says there are millions of turkeys on the ranges in that locality and offers to head an expedition that
