## GLOBE SIGHTS AND SILVER BELTLETS

Current News of Busy Globe Told in  
Brevities

**Enlarging Stage.**—Manager Charles Alexander is enlarging the stage and otherwise improving the unique theater bearing his name.

**School Opening.**—The public schools opened at Crowley on lower Pinto creek Monday, with an enrollment of sixteen pupils.

**Brought in Murderers.**—Deputy Sheriff Armer of Roosevelt reached the city yesterday having in charge the two Indians accused of murdering Koo Diz Zeena at Gisela last Monday. The young bucks were held to the grand jury by Justice Hill of Payson.

**Ask for \$1,505.**—E. J. Bennett of Phoenix has commenced an action in district court against Laura P. Edwards, administrator of the estate of E. J. Edwards, deceased, to recover \$1,505. The plaintiff claims that his claim against the estate was duly filed but was rejected by the administrator, resigned, and the present administrator. A judgment against Edwards was secured by the plaintiff in the amount sued for in the district court of Maricopa county in 1904.

**Called by Death.**—Fillimon Gomez, aged 36 and single, for some time employed at the Live Oak mine, died of chronic stomach trouble yesterday morning. The funeral services will be conducted from the late home of the deceased this morning at 11 o'clock.

**On Vag Charge.**—Peter Sullivan, a well known miner of the district, is confined in the city jail on a vagrancy charge and will have a hearing in Judge Thomas' court this morning. Sullivan has been drunk for about fifteen days and is said to have been bawling and bracing people on the streets for money.

**Pugilistic.**—George Arnold, boozy, bloody and battered, was arrested yesterday morning and confined in the city jail charged with disturbing the peace. Arnold declared hostilities to Ben Kipler in McDonagh's saloon first and followed it up by making a second attack on the same man in Keegan's saloon about an hour later. Both men were arrested. Kipler made bond. They will have hearings in city court this morning.

**Sanitary Step.**—A. Hansen, manager of the Dominion hotel, was arrested yesterday on a warrant charging him

with maintaining a nuisance. A poorly regulated cess pool in the rear of the hotel is responsible for the trouble. Hansen will have a hearing in Justice Thomas' court this afternoon.

**Death of Infant.**—Viola, the four-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Benbow, after a brief illness with colic, died yesterday morning. The funeral will take place from the family residence, near Bailey's blacksmith shop, this afternoon at 2 o'clock.

**Vaudeville.**—Charles Alexander, manager of the Alexander theater, has secured the McCarthy & Doyle vaudeville company. The Alexander is now in the Arizona-Colorado vaudeville circuit.

## GREAT SCARCITY OF SMALL BILLS

A CLEAR INDICATION OF TREMENDOUS ACTIVITY OF TRADE ALL OVER THE COUNTRY, SAYS U. S. TREASURER TREAT.

NEW YORK, October 7.—United States Treasurer Treat says that in spite of all efforts by the treasury department during the past few months to establish a sufficient supply, there is now great difficulty experienced in meeting the demands for small bills.

The treasurer's office worked overtime during June, July and August, with vacations postponed, that there might be a sufficient supply, but at this time there are three days' supply of one-dollar bills, two days' supply of two-dollar bills and ten-dollar bills, and ten days' supply of five-dollar bills.

The output of small bills has increased fully 25 per cent over last year. Within ten days two additional machines will be put up, which it is expected will increase the output 25 per cent.

Treasurer Treat says the great demand for small bills this year is a clear indication of tremendous activity of trade throughout the country. Another indication is the fact that the retirement of national bank note circulation during the past six months has been less than in corresponding months of 1906.
