SHORT STORIES OF THE CITY

To Marry.—A marriage license has been issued to E. A. Myers of Globe, and Charlotte Rogers of Pima.—Solomonville Bulletin.

Special Train Service.—General Passenger Agent M. O. Bicknell of the Randolph lines has given out the statement that special train service will be in operation between Globe and Phoenix and Bisbee and Phoenix during the territorial fair.

Witnesses swore that they saw Ataway receive money for the stuff.

To Deport Ross.—An arrangement has been made by the city and county authorities whereby Joe Ross, the dope fiend, held in the county jail on a vagrancy charge, will be sent out of the city on this morning's train. Ross says that he can secure employment in the southern part of the territory and the authorities will defray the expenses of his transportation. The superintendent states that a handsome new school is being erected at Black Warrior, where J. W. Stewart, in the old building, is at present teaching a school with an enrollment of thirty-nine.
