#### "PH. FREUDENTHAL," "Foreman of the Grand Jury," True Bills Voted Friday.

It was reported yesterday that the indictments returned were voted upon on the preceding day, and United States Attorney Alexander stated last evening that he was up until after midnight drawing up the indictments. It is understood that there was a large majority in favor of the indictments, the vote in most cases being three to one for the indictments.

Whether or not the perjury cases will come to trial during the present term of court is conjecture, although it is known that the government is anxious to dispose of the cases at once. Judge Hawkins of El Paso, who appeared for the Phelps Dodge officials in the federal court at Santa Fe, arrived in the city last evening, but no statement was given out by him regarding the probable course of the defense. Capt. George D. Christy, assistant United States attorney was also an arrival on last evening's train, from Phoenix, and he will probably assist in the prosecution if the cases come to trial during the present term of court.

#### Moonshiner Gets Off.

In the United States court yesterday morning Peter Swenson, the old man from the Gila valley who pleaded guilty to running an illicit still, was sentenced by Judge Nave to spend six months in the county jail dating from June 6, last and to pay a fine of \$1,000. As his term of sentence has expired, he was released from custody and Judge Nave allowed the old man to take his time in paying the fine. It is understood that the cause for leniency in the matter on the part of the court, was that Swenson had foiled a jail break at the Graham county jail at Solomonville, several weeks ago.

The trials of those indicted for violating the Edmunds act were set for tomorrow. Edna Earl, jointly indicted with Tom Smith, asked for a severance of trials and she will be tried apart from Smith.

#### The Kaiser's Talisman.

It is interesting to learn that the Kaiser has brought to England the famous Hohenzollern talisman, which for centuries has been credited with a supernatural power to protect its wearer from harm of any kind. This imperial talisman, a massive gold ring with a square, dark colored stone, which the emperor is said to wear on the middle finger of his left hand, has a highly romantic history, dating from the far-off days when his ancestors, the Margravs of Nuremberg, followed their leaders to the capture of the holy sepulcher from the Moslems. The ring, which was captured in a hard fought battle under the walls of Jerusalem, came into the possession of Margrat Ulrich, from whom it has descended to his successors, generation after generation, as a highly prized heirloom. The sentence from the Koran which adorned the ring when worn by Saladin and his successors has been removed and a Latin cross engraved in its place.—Tit-Bits.
