May Roundtree, who kidnaped a twelve year old daughter, Caroline, from the Crittenton home and threatened to kill the child and herself rather than have her returned there, resisted her resolution after seeking advice and consented to the girl's return.

Mining experts, said to represent the Superior and Arizona Copper companies, have made a thorough examination of the old Silver Queen mine near Phoenix with a view of reopening it in the near future.

have been scheduled as well as bronco busting and other amusements, with a masquerade ball for New Year's night.


