

# OUTRAGED JUSTICE HAS GREAT RECORD FOR YEAR

### Seventy Lynchings in 1909 With Georgia Leading the Procession

WASHINGTON, D. C., December 22.—Lynchings in 1909 have numbered seventy, the highest number recorded since 1904. The victims numbered 111 whites and 59 negroes. The lynchings occurred in twelve states and one territory—New Mexico. As in previous years, crimes, or alleged crimes against women and murders, caused most of these summary executions. One occurring in Cairo, Ill., combined causes and resulted in the lacing of the city under military control for several days. The Cairo lynchings were the only cases of the kind that occurred during the Ohio River during the year. Several double lynchings occurred at various points in the south, and Oklahoma furnished a quadruple lynchings with four cattlemen as the victims.

The following record of the word "lynching" has been held to apply to the summary punishment inflicted by a mob or by any number of persons on a person alleged to have committed a crime. It states the seventy lynchings cases here recorded are classified as follows:


