IDEAL WEATHER for the harvest of the cotton crop continues to prevail and the planters are busily engaged in picking out the most disappointing crop, so far as the price is concerned, this country has ever known.

MR. HARRISON STEWART was notified last Saturday that he was the fortunate winner of a handsome pair of horses raffled in Natchez recently. The horses have been received by him and appear to be very valuable animals.

WE REGRET to note the serious illness of Mr. Ed. Lynch, who for some time has been extremely ill with continued fever. His illness has assumed a dangerous form and his family and friends are deeply concerned about his condition.

A COMMUNICATION in this issue represents the bridges over Clarke's and Phelps' bayous as being in a dangerous condition. In these hard times the loss of a team of mules would be a serious one, and the loss of life, in the event of an accident on either of these bridges, is by no means improbable.

DISTRICT COURT will convene here on Monday the 19th day of November. The civil docket is the lightest for years; the criminal docket will be a large one, among the more important cases to be tried are W. S. Bridewell, Montgomery Sims, Albert Davis and Bowles Collins, all charged with murder, and Henry Harris charged with manslaughter. John Harris, convicted of murder at the May term is also in jail, awaiting the result of a motion in arrest of judgment to be tried next month.

MESSRS. G. C. GOLDMAN, S. P. Hopkins, James Curry and Joseph Mirdock, jury commissioners, met at the clerk's office last Monday and selected a jury for the term of court beginning on the 3rd Monday in November. This will be the first jury for this parish under the new law, and under the provisions of which the names of both grand and petit jurors are kept secret until the convening of court. The names of the jurors selected are not disclosed to the Sheriff within 15 days of the meeting of the court, and the jurors when notified to be present are required to keep secret the fact of their selections.
