Culebra Bill, Pedro of Guantanamo, Patrick Spite, San Juan, Brooklyn Bill, Canarsie, Harlem Mike, Hobo, and Nutmeg II, in convention assembled, bade an official farewell to the Atlantic Coast when the Atlantic fleet sailed from Norfolk.

Patrick Spite, Nutmeg II, and the others are some of the famous mascots of the Atlantic fleet, and although there is no way of telling, there is not a sailor on board any of Admiral Evans's big fighters who does not believe that every one of them knows exactly what the cruise means to the Atlantic fleet.

The sailors are just as careful of these mascots as they are of the magazines, and there is not a man among them who would not have a funny feeling about his heart if anything should happen to any one of these little animals, whose presence on board they consider one of the surest guarantees of a successful voyage to San Francisco.

On the day before sailing one of the sixteen battleships that are going to the Pacific, and he found out that about twenty-five goats, one donkey, thirty-two dogs, two pigs, and a dozen parrots. These are the mascots of Admiral Evans's mighty armada, and an interesting lot they are.

At the head of the list stands Pedro of Guantanamo, admitted by all the sailors to be the smartest goat mascot in existence. Pedro, they say, can do anything a dog can, while as for goats they declare none ever existed with half the intelligence of that of the Virginia's famous mascot. Pedro, it will be remembered, is the goat that is fond of waste paper, particularly mail, and he is known throughout the fleet as "Capt. Schroeder's waste basket."

Nutmeg II, of the Connecticut, successor of the intelligent little animal of the same name that died on board the flagship Connecticut when that vessel was in New York, is too young for a diploma, but he is learning, and by the time the fleet reaches Magellan he will have become a full-fledged mascot in good standing, so say the sailors of the flagship.

Patrick Spite, once the mascot of the cruiser Galveston, it is said, was kidnapped from that vessel by the men of the Maine. Once upon a time Patrick got into print as the goat that ate a box of matches and then drank a pint of benzine. The matches went off, so the story goes, but, strange to say, the benzine did not explode, and Patrick Spite is today as healthy and well groomed a mascot as there is to be found in the fleet.

Culebra Bill is a native of Cuba, and was brought to the United States by Chief Boatswain's Mate Stanow, when Stanow was on the cruiser Des Moines. Bill is now on the Louisiana, Brooklyn Bill, as his name indicates, comes from the borough across the river from Manhattan. He was once the property of the armored cruiser Brooklyn. Bill is fond of paint, can digest nails, and smoke a pipe. He is on the battleship Minnesota, the flagship of Admiral Thomas. Bill traveled over 25,000 miles as the mascot of the Brooklyn.

San Juan, now the official good luck provider of the battleship Vermont, according to tradition, was on the Olympia during the battle of Manila, and that is why, the sailors say, he is hard of hearing. The noise of the terrific firing made by the guns in that engagement, they say, affected his eardrums. Harlem Mike, also a New Yorker, is on the Missouri, while Canarsie cavorts about the decks of the Kentucky. Hobo is beloved by every man on the Kearsarge.

Of the dogs, every ship has from one to three, while the ships that own pigs are the Alabama and the Connecticut. The Alabama is also the owner of the donkey. It was reported that Blithers, the ladder climbing dog, was on board the Kansas. This is a mistake. Blithers is now at sea on the torpedo boat destroyer Hull. Last summer when the Hull was in New York Blithers was stolen. A week later the sailors say, "he found his way back."

One of the sailors on the Connecticut was asked what would happen if all the mascots were washed overboard.

"We would turn around and go back home," he answered, "but no such thing is going to happen, for our mascots don't stay on deck in rough weather."

CATCHING WILD ANIMALS.

How Carl Hagenbeck Obtains His Supply for the Zoological Parks.

The greatest animal dealer in the world is Carl Hagenbeck, who lives at Stellingen, a suburb of Hamburg. Here can be purchased almost any wild animal in existence. Asked recently how he managed to keep up his stock, Mr. Hagenbeck replied, says the Montreal Standard: "From my depots. I have depots everywhere—six in Asia, three in Africa, several in Europe, two in America, as well as depots in Siberia. I have over sixty travelers working for me all the time, whose sole business is to collect animals and ship them to me here. They employ thousands of natives to help them. Then I buy up everything that comes into Hamburg, and I may say that if anybody abroad wishes to dispose of his animals he invariably writes to me."

The next step is to telegraph to an agent in the neighborhood, who inspects the stock with a view to purchase. "For instance," continued Mr. Hagenbeck, "the other day I received a letter from a resident in Rhodesia saying he had got a large collection of African deer and birds, and wished to get rid of them. Within three weeks I had secured the whole collection, and they are now on their way to Hamburg. I have at present several travelers on the way home, some of them with very large consignments of animals. Next week I expect one of my men from Siberia. He is bringing me deer, sheep and other animals."

Two animals, it seems, are exceedingly scarce just now. These are the hippopotamus and the rhinoceros.

"They are taken from their mothers when quite young—no easy feat, as you can imagine—and then brought up on milk. The feeding of them, when you have finally secured them, is no light undertaking. A baby hippopotamus will drink thirty pints of milk a day and bellow for more. To arrange for such a supply in the desert, means that a large number of tame goats have to be taken along with the hunting party. Thirty years ago I supplied the London Zoological Gardens with an African rhinoceros. It was the first rhinoceros brought to Europe since the days of the Roman amphitheatre."

Another very scarce animal is the giraffe, and between 1880 and 1900 only three giraffes were imported into Europe. Among his innumerable adventures with animals Mr. Hagenbeck had one with a giraffe: "In Suez, some years ago, a full grown giraffe ran away with me. The rope I held him by got entangled around my arm, and I could not get free. I was dragged along the streets and fearfully banged about. When I at length got loose I was so exhausted that I was obliged to lie down for a quarter of an hour without moving." The king of animal dealers considers that his narrowest escape took place while superintending the lowering into a pit of a huge alligator. "Suddenly, with a sweep of its tail, it knocked me right into the middle of a dozen large alligators. I jumped out in an instant, or I must assuredly have been torn to pieces."
