Be it known that on this 1st day of June, 1908, it being the first Monday in said month and the day for the regular meeting of the Police Jury of the Parish of Tensas, said Hon'ble Body met at the Court House in St. Joseph, La.

There were present: Mr. F. H. Curry, President, and Messrs. S. D. Farrar, Sam'l. Marks, J. G. O'Kelley, R. B. Lynch, Wm. A. Register and L. T. Hunter, members.

On motion a jury of Freeholders, composed of Messrs. F. McC. Hopkins, S. Marks, D. Muir, D. Morris and T. E. Grace was appointed to lay off and trace a public road from Hard Times landing to Southwood plantation and to report at next meeting of this Board.

Mr. G. R. Carter appeared and presented a bill for \$65.25 balance due him for one half of two months work with traction engine of road out fit. Mr. Carter was referred to Reeves & Co. for payment, as Reeves & Co., through their agent, B. E. Pool, had contracted with this Board to pay one half of Mr. Carter's wages, Mr. Carter having been paid one half already by the Parish.
