the farm occupied by him or his farily, and that any adult the farm occupied by him or his amily, The sole purpose of the census is to secure general statis-
ital information regarding the population and resources of the country, and replies are required from individuals only in order to permit the compilation of such general statistics. The census has nothing to do with taxation, with army or he regulation of immigrotion, or with the enforcement o any national, state or local law or or ordinance, nor cant any
person be harmed in any way by furnishing the information person be harmed in any way by furnishing the information
required. There need be no fear that any disclosure will be required. There need be no fear that any discloaure will be the due protection of the rights and interests of the persons urnishing information every employee of the Census Bureav
prohibited, under heavy penalty, from disclosing any inlormation which may thus come to his knowledge. I therefore earnestly urge upon all persons to answer promptly, completely and accurately all inquiries addreseed Bureau, and thereby to contribute their share toward mak-
