Wire Flashes

The Bethlehem steel strike was officially declared off.

The steamer Venus blockaded Bluefields. There had been fighting at Rama.

The railroad bill was displaced in the Senate by the naval appropriation bill.

The submission of evidence in the Ballinger-Pinchot investigation has been ended.

The United States offered to mediate in the threatened war between Peru and Ecuador.

Thirty black spots were observed on the sun, one of them 150,000 miles in diameter.

Twenty to thirty men were killed and fifty injured in a boiler explosion at Canton, Ohio.

Several persons were killed and great damage done to property by a tornado in Oklahoma.

Six bishops of the Catholic church were consecrated simultaneously at St. Paul by Archbishop Ireland.

Work on the Bush-Everett gas pipe line from Caddo field to St. Louis will start within sixty days.

Nine crowned heads of Europe and Theodore Roosevelt were among the guests of King George at a dinner.

Arrangements are being perfected at Washington for the visit of the members of the Louisiana legislature.

Astronomers secured valuable photographs and data during the passage of the earth through the tail of the comet.

Thousands passed the bier of King Edward. Theodore Roosevelt rode in the eighth carriage during the ceremonies.

Senator Stone, of Missouri, will introduce a resolution in the Senate inquiring into Senator Knox's Nicaraguan policy.

One hundred persons were killed by a dynamite explosion that wrecked the Rural Guard Barracks at Pinar Del Rio, Cuba.

Henry Watterson, in an address before the Canadian Publishers' Association at Toronto, deplored the passing of personal journalism, saying the duel is more interesting than the libel suit.

The body of King Edward was removed from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Hall, while the remains lay in state.

The College of Methodist Bishops vetoed the action of the conference at Asheville, N. C., by which the name of the church was changed to the Methodist church.

Revs. W. B. Murrain, W. S. Lambuth, E. D. Mouson, R. G. Waterhouse and J. H. McCoy were elected bishops by the general conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

The Gulf Coast Lumber Exporters' Association, in session at Pensacola, was told that the soda-dip process for export material is unsatisfactory.

Four thousand independent Democrats of Tennessee, in session at Nashville, rebuked Governor Patterson for rapping the judiciary, and nominated tickets for the Supreme Court and the court of appeals.

The Methodist Conference at Asheville adopted the committee report placing the control of Vanderbilt University with the church.

The American Cotton Manufacturers' Association, in session at Charlotte, went on record as favoring the ship subsidy.

Paul J. Rainey and Harry Payne Whitney have purchased the steamer Roosevelt, and will sail for the arctic regions June 20 on a hunting expedition.

The Mississippi Press Association, in session at New Albany, adopted resolutions favoring New Orleans as the place for holding the Panama Exposition.

It is announced that the Mississippi Central Railroad will go to Mobile from Hattiesburg, Miss., over the New Orleans, Mobile and Chicago railroad.
