The above is an extract from a speech made at Vidalia last Tuesday by the Hon. Thos. C. Barrett, of Shreveport, at a meeting held in the interest of the candidacy of Hon. John T. Michel for Governor.

Mr. Barrett, who is the candidate of the regular democracy for Lieutenant-Governor, and who is one of the ablest men in the State, was referring to the Hon. John M. Parker, who with the Hon. Don. Caffery is the chief tugman for the Good Government cause, and these two gentlemen are being heard every day on the stump advocating the election of Judge Hall.

When it is remembered that Mr. Parker boasts that he voted for Mr. Taft for President, and failed to vote for Roosevelt only because he had neglected to register, and that he made speeches in advocacy of the election of Mr. Caffery as the Republican candidate for Governor only eight years ago, it seems a little strange that these two men should be the chief features in every meeting of the Good Government League which claims to be a movement within the Democratic Party.

Surely, as Mr. Barrett so aptly puts it, those of us who have minds to think do not need to be taught how to select a Democratic Governor by Republicans. True this year Messrs. Parker and Caffery claim to be Democrats and will vote in the Democratic primary, but is it not reasonably certain that both of them will vote next year for the Republican candidate for President?

The fact is the Good Government League is not a Democratic movement. It is nothing but a movement of disgruntled outs, backed up by such men as Parker and Caffery, who have no political principles and know no party allegiance but claim in one election to be Democrats and in the next vote the Republican ticket. The purpose of these men is to disrupt and destroy the Democratic party in Louisiana. For that reason they are the foremost and most bitter opponents of Jared Y. Sanders and John T. Michel and of the regular democracy as represented by those gentlemen.

When you come to vote, Democrats of Tensas, ask yourself whether you propose to vote for men like Sanders, Ransdell, Michel and Barrett who have the solid support of the regular Democrats throughout the State, or will you vote with Don. Caffery and John Parker?

It is a poor man who takes so little interest in public affairs as to willfully disfranchise himself by neglecting the payment of his poll tax. Unless same is paid before the end of the year, you cannot vote for two years hence and will therefore lose all voice in politics. Can you afford it?

SALE OF TIMBER.

In the Matter of the Affairs of the Minor, W. Watson Weatherly.

—AND—

In the Matter of the Affairs of the Interdict, Scott Watson.

By virtue of the authority of a family meeting held on the 30th day of October, 1911, in the above matter, authorizing, empowering and directing me, the said Tutrix, and me, the said Curator, to sell at public auction, after due advertisement, and otherwise according to law, we will on—

10th day of December, 1911,

at the principal Court House door in the Town of St. Joseph, Louisiana, sell upon the terms and conditions hereinafter stipulated, the interest of said minor, which is one-third interest, and the interest of said interdict, which is a one-half interest, in and to the merchantable standing timber on the "Oscoda" and "Buckhorn" plantations in Tensas Parish, La.

The same to be sold on the following terms and conditions as fixed by said family meeting, to-wit:

The minimum scale of prices for stumpage, at which prices the several kinds of said stumpage were valued and appraised by said family meeting, to-wit:

Cypress timber stumpage, at \$5.00 per thousand feet.

Gum timber stumpage, at \$1.50 per thousand feet.

Elm timber stumpage, at \$1.00 per thousand feet.

Oak timber stumpage, at \$2.50 per thousand feet.

Ash timber stumpage, at \$2.50 per thousand feet.

That said timber be sold, for not less than the above prices for the respective classes, and that all the merchantable timber on said plantations be sold en bloc and altogether to one and the same purchaser, and under the following terms, conditions and stipulations, to-wit:

1st. Immediately upon the adjudication and consummation of the sale, the purchaser shall pay to the interdict, through his said Curator, the sum of One Thousand Dollars in cash, and shall pay to the Tutrix of said minor the sum of Three Hundred and Thirty-three Dollars and thirty-three one-hundredths, the purchaser shall thereupon and thereafter have the right to saw into lumber at least One Thousand Dollars' worth of the interdict's timber, and Three Hundred and Thirty-three and one-third Dollars' worth of the minor's timber; and when the purchaser shall have saved a Thousand Dollars' worth of the interdict's interest in said timber, and Three Hundred and Thirty-three and one-third Dollars' worth of the minor's interest in said timber, based on the above named prices for each class, or upon such other greater prices for which it may sell, the said purchaser shall pay to the said Curator for said interdict, another sum of One Thousand Dollars, and to said Tutrix of said minor another sum of Three Hundred and Thirty-three and one-third Dollars, and so on until all of the interdict's interest and said minor's interest in said timber shall have been paid for and saved, it being of the essence of this contract that, after the timber in which the interest of the interdict amounts to as much as One Thousand Dollars, and the interest of the minor amounts to as much as the sum of Three Hundred and Thirty-three and one-third Dollars has been saved into lumber, no more timber shall be cut until the additional sum of One Thousand Dollars has been paid and advanced to pay for and cover the interest of the interdict, and the additional sum of Three Hundred and Thirty-three and one-third Dollars has been paid and advanced to pay for and cover the interest of the minor in the future cutting of an equal amount.

2nd. The Curator for the interdict and the Tutrix for minor shall have the right to name and appoint a scaler to scale said timber, who shall be paid by the purchaser the usual compensation, and the Curator or the Tutrix shall have the right to discharge the scaler so employed, and employ others at will.

3rd. The purchaser shall have the right to erect a saw-mill upon said property for the purpose of sawing up said timber, with the necessary rights of way for that purpose, and with the necessary ground and room for erecting buildings, stables, etc., and stacking lumber, without extra charge.

4th. The purchaser shall enter into the performance of this contract to continue to comply with same without unreasonable delay, unless something happens to prevent over which the parties have no control.

5th. The right is to be reserved to the owner to use timber on said plantations for plantation purposes, and to reserve enough for such plantation purposes in the future.
