## POLICE JURY.

STATE OF LOUISIANA,

PARISH OF TENSAS.

St. Joseph, La., December 4th, 1911.

Be it known that on this 4th day of December, 1911, it being the first Monday in said month, and the day for the regular meeting of the Police Jury of the Parish of Tensas, said Honorable Body met at the Court House in St. Joseph, La.

There were present: Mr. F. H. Curry, President, and Messrs. Jno. Murdoch, R. B. Lynch, B. F. McVay, Louis T. Hunter and Wm. A. Register, members.

Absent: Mr. Douglas Muir. On motion, Mr. Hunter was authorized to have Texas Road, from Levee Road to Rail Road crossing, repaired and holes filled in.

On motion, Messrs. Hunter and Register were appointed a Committee to have bridge across Little Tensas River, at New Foundland rebuilt.

On motion the road tax of \$1.00 paid by Branch Dixon, was ordered refunded, he being over road age.

On motion, duly seconded, the following ordinance was unanimously adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Tensas, That the Parish License for the sale, at retail, of pistols, pistol cartridges, blank pistols and blank pistol cartridges for the year 1912, be and the same is hereby fixed at Two Thousand Dollars, the same to be due and collectible on January 1st, 1912, and to expire December 31st, 1912.

Be it further ordained, That the six months license to be issued during the latter half of the year 1912 be and the same is hereby fixed at One Hundred per centum of the license imposed by the State of Louisiana for the same.

The following ordinance was unanimously adopted:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Tensas, That Parish License for the sale, at retail, of pistols, pistol cartridges, blank pistols and blank pistol cartridges for the year 1912, be and the same is hereby fixed at an amount equal to One Hundred per centum of the license imposed by the State of Louisiana for the same.

The following bills were allowed and ordered paid:

There being no further business, the Police Jury adjourned sine die.
