CAPT. COLUMBUS ALLEN DIES IN-NEW-ORLEANS.

Following publication of the Rodney, Miss., church incident, in last week's issue, and with the account given by Capt. Columbus Allen, a participant in the affair, it is appropriate to mention his death, which occurred in New Orleans on Sunday evening. The Times-Picayune speaks of Capt. Allen:

Stricken suddenly with heart trouble, Capt. Columbus Allen, a prominent figure in the rice industry of this State, and known for the last fifty years among local members of the Board of Trade, died suddenly at his home, 1532 Fourchee street, Sunday afternoon. He went home about 2 o'clock, after an automobile ride through the city, and told members of his family that he was not feeling well. He went up stairs to bed, a doctor was called and before the physician could prescribe Capt. Allen lapsed into unconsciousness and died.

Capt. Allen had a host of friends in this city. Born in Yazoo City, Miss., August 12th, 1829, he came to New Orleans at an early age and enlisted at the outbreak of the war in the army of the Confederacy. He joined the battalion of Major Charles Drew, on the peninsula in 1861, serving as a private without being mustered in. He and his brother, Cicero Allen, returned to New Orleans to accept commissions in a regiment then forming, but the process was so slow that they left the front and joined an Arkansas cavalry command, the Briarfield Rebels, in time to participate in the Battle of Shiloh.

For the remainder of the war Capt. Allen served in the Western army, rising to the rank of captain. In the last year of the war he was captured and sent to Ship Island, from where he was sent to Fort Warren, at Boston, and was paroled two months after the war came to an end.

Upon his return to this city, Capt. Allen engaged in the rice brokerage business with his father. He was so successful in his chosen field that his name was taken as a bond by all who had dealings with him, and for years he had been a prominent figure in the Board of Trade.

Mr. H. L. Smith has received his new back, which is large, handsome and comfortable. The back came from Macon, Miss.
